Mike Springer, Superintendent of Northern Wells Community Schools



Mike and his wife, Belle, have been in education for almost 30 years. Belle currently teaches at Ossian Elementary School. They have 4 children and their first grandchild on the way. Mike has been commuting from the Avon area while their youngest daughter finished high school but now he and Belle have moved to Wells County full time. This will be his 3rd year with NWCS.

2 Focus areas for NWCS currently are the Graduate Profile and growing enrolment.

For the graduate profile there are five main objectives:

- Articulating and communicating it
- Vertical progression
- Dual Credit courses and a weighted GPA
- Consistent data analysis for all grade levels
- Increasing career and technical education opportunities

The current enrollment is approximately 2400 students, and we are an open enrollment district, so we take kids from anywhere, not just within our district lines. Our education funding (to pay teachers) is based on a formula using the number of kids enrolled which currently is approximately \$6500 per student.

The two main objectives for increasing enrollment are:

- Increasing outreach and communication with prospective families
- Increasing alternative education programming

The district is looking for community involvement in the strategic plan and you can find out more on the NWCS website.

The new middle school construction is going well and is on schedule to open in August 2024.
