OUR SPEAKER THIS WEEK

Erin Prible, Executive Director for the Wells County Chamber of Commerce



Erin has worked in the non-profit sector for over 20 years, including managing boards of directors, marketing, public awareness, volunteer recruitment, and special events. Erin has been the Executive Director for the Wells County Chamber for ten years and coordinates the Wells County Leadership Academy.

There are 432 Chamber members. As members of the Chamber, your name is published in the Chamber Directory, which goes out to approximately 7,000 households per year. Your business is listed on their website, which directly links to your social media and/or website page.

Erin discussed some of the upcoming events the Chamber has going on. Their Business After Hours events are booked up through end of September with some in October and November scheduled.

Erin also oversees the Wells County Leadership Academy. This is a unique leadership academy for Wells County and started in 2008, with a collaboration with Huntington University foundation's Center for Leadership Studies. The leadership academy goes over Habitudes, images that form leadership habits and attitudes. One specific habitude Erin discussed was "The Iceberg". Although, you can see the top of the iceberg (or a person), the iceberg goes deep under the water and you cannot see that part of the iceberg, just like a person will have a lot of past or hurt you cannot see on the top. Other topics included in the program are charter development, ethics, networking skills, team building, and coaching to name a few.

Erin said the Chamber has two fundraisers a year. Their chicken BBQ, they sell over 2700 chickens and their golf outing with 36 teams this past year.
