OUR SPEAKER THIS WEEK

Kayleen Reusser, author



Kayleen apologized for missing the prior meeting she was scheduled for and said to make up for it she would give us each a free book and autograph it for us.

She has written 10 books on WWII and interviewed over 260 WWII veterans for those books. She and her husband have also toured many WWII sites and museums. Many of her books include stories of people from Wells County.

One of her books is called <u>It Was Our War Too</u> and focuses on the youth during the war times and their

stories. One of the stories included in that book was about Bernice Stoppenhagen (from Wells County) and how she and her two sisters were put on a train out of London and taken to the countryside looking for someone to take them in so they could escape the bombings happening in London.

Another book is <u>Born to be Soldiers</u> which focuses on women veterans including Elizabeth (Betty) White who was from Ossian and was a pilot in WWII. She was also an officer, which means she was college educated, which is unusual for that time period.

One of Kayleen's other books is <u>Captured</u> which highlights WWII POWs. One of the men in the book is Grant Workman, whose daughter Judy is from Bluffton. Grant was captured by Japan at age 16 and put into forced labor until he was 19. He later married and had a family here in Wells County, working at National Oil.

Kayleen also has two coloring books she has created with stories of some of the veterans she has met. One features women and one features men.

Next month she will be releasing her first book about Vietnam veterans. The book launch is October 22nd at the Bluffton Library, and she hopes to have some veterans from the book there to sign copies of the book as well.

All of her books are available on Amazon.
