### Overview

#### Detailed description

At the beginning of the covid pandemic, masks were unavailable or hard to acquire to the majority of people. We wanted to help protect vulnerable members of the community and essential workers. We designed, produced, and shared masks with local nonprofits and business staff including YMCA staff shelter, adoption agency nurses, Veteran Affairs support staff, Connections for the Homeless staff and shelter, Misericordia, the U.S. post office staff, and many more. We also donated masks to C&W Market to sell; the sales helped cover the cost of the groceries they prepared and shared with food-insecure families. To cover costs of this project, we sold masks at an affordable price locally and nationally. Many supporters were generous and donated beyond the cost the masks. At the close of the project, we donated leftover mask materials to the local dry cleaner
