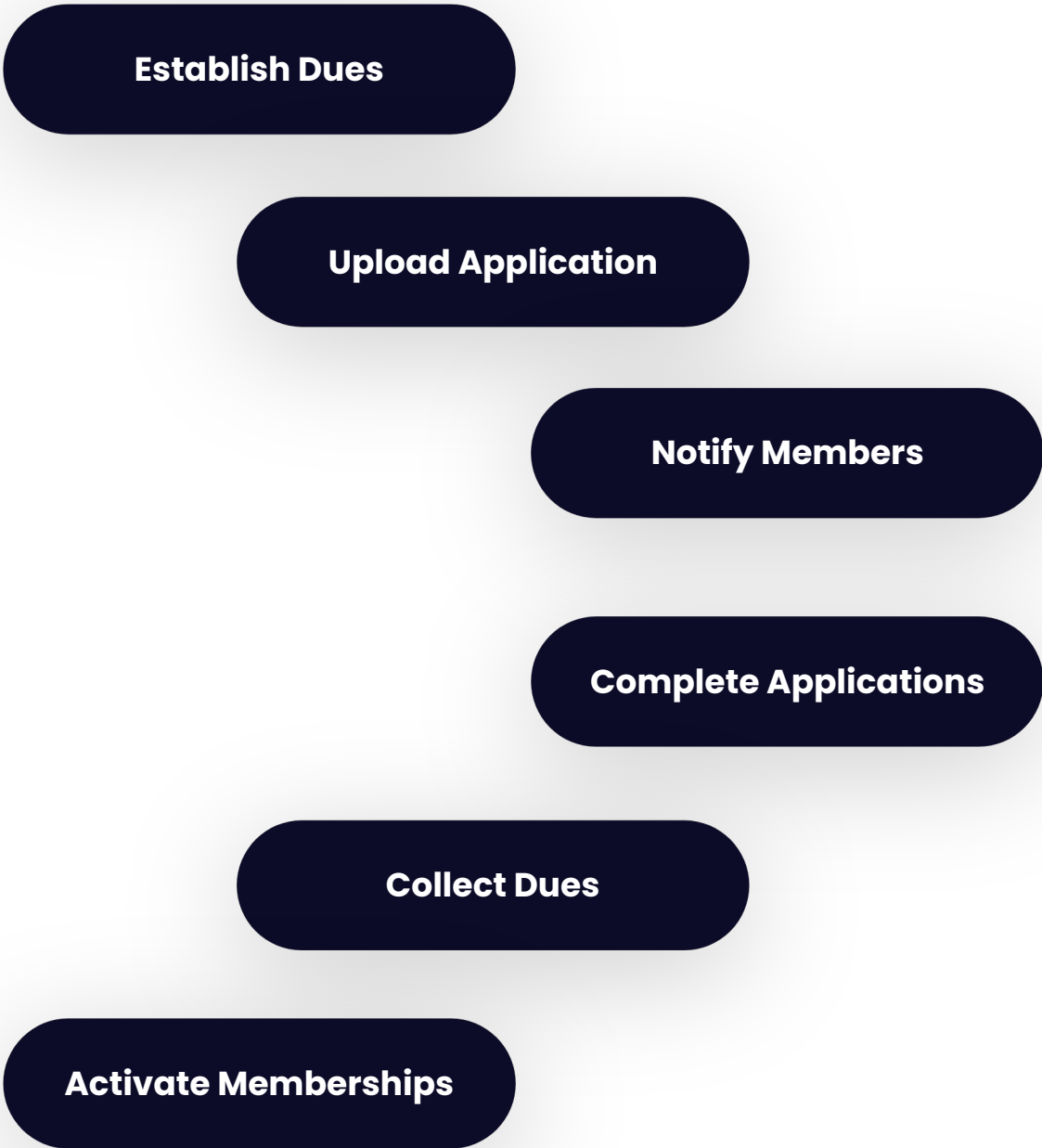

Phase #1

Membership Processing



Goal: Complete Membership Processing by June 30, 2026.

Try Pitch

1. Establish Dues

Determine annual club dues, district dues, and payment options.

2. Upload Application

Upload the final membership application to the club website.

3. Notify Members

Share the member portal and application link with all charter members.

4. Complete Applications

All members complete and submit their membership applications.

5. Collect Dues

Collect membership dues and verify payment status.

6. Activate Memberships

Add members to ClubRunner and Rotary International records.

Goal: Elect Club Leadership by June 30, 2026.

Try Pitch

President

Provides overall leadership for the club and ensures meetings, projects, and goals stay on track. Serves as the primary representative of the club to Rotary International, the district, and the community.

Secretary

Maintains club records, meeting minutes, membership information, and official correspondence. Ensures required reports and administrative tasks are completed on time.

Treasurer

Manages club finances, collects dues, and maintains accurate financial records. Provides regular financial reports and ensures funds are used responsibly.

Membership Chair

Leads efforts to attract, welcome, and retain members. Helps create a positive club experience that encourages growth and engagement.

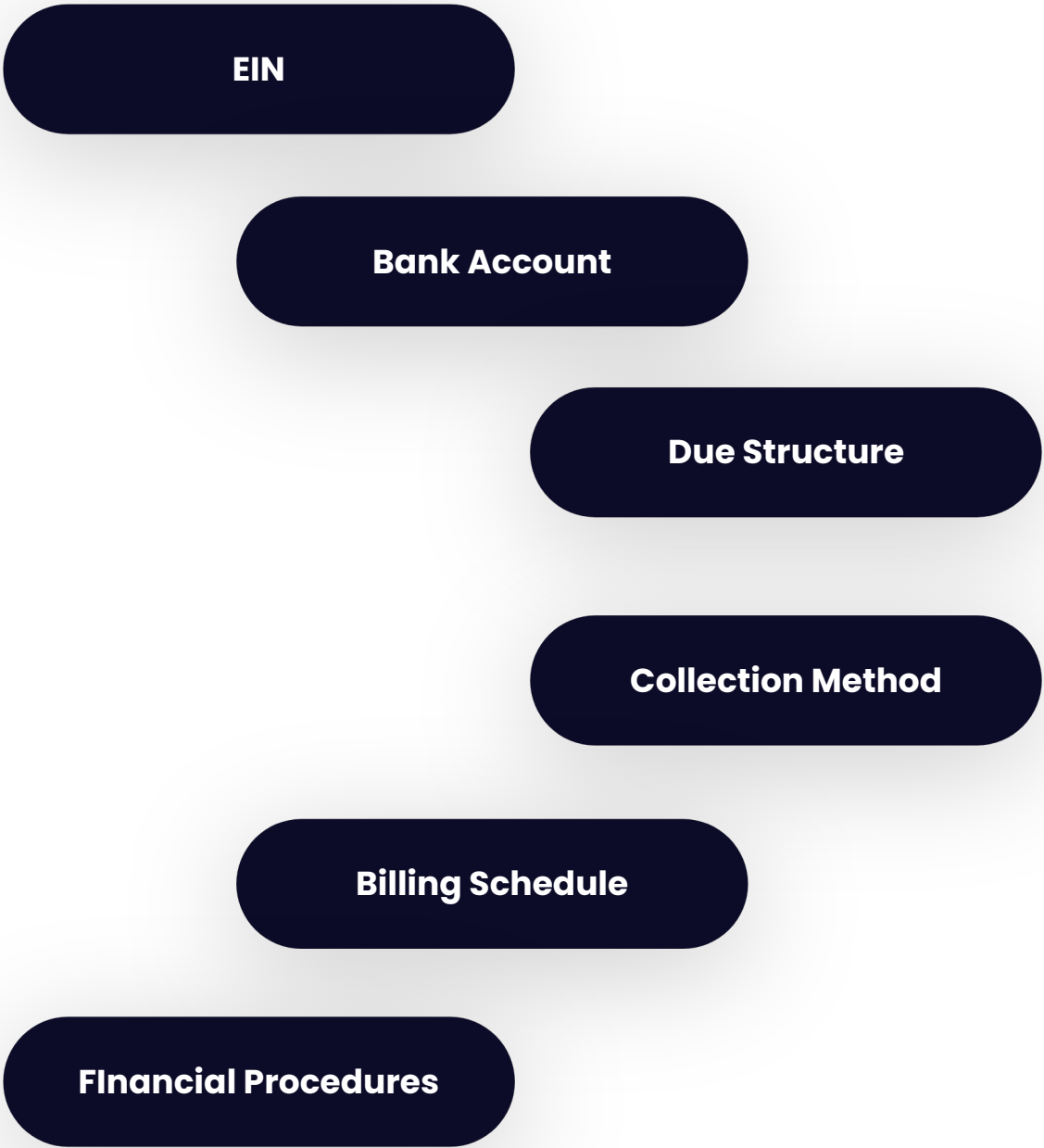
Public Image Chair

Promotes the club's activities through social media, newsletters, websites, and local media. Ensures the community understands the club's impact and mission.



Phase #3

Financial Setup



Goal: Complete financial setup by June 15, 2026.

Try Pitch

1. Obtain an EIN

Apply for a Federal Employer Identification Number for the club.

2. Open a Bank Account

Establish a club bank account for dues, fundraising, and operating expenses.

3. Establish Dues

Determine annual membership dues and any applicable district or Rotary International fees.

4. Select a Collection Method

Choose how members will pay dues and how payments will be tracked.

5. Determine Billing Schedule

Decide whether dues will be collected monthly, quarterly, or annually.

6. Create Financial Procedures

Establish basic policies for deposits, reimbursements, approvals, and financial reporting.

Goal: Complete Next Phases by August 30, 2026.

Try Pitch
