District Grant Activity

In Rotary year 2020-21, there are 27 District Grant funded projects by 21 clubs for \$88,813 in District Designated Funds (DDF) allocated to those projects. Funds were distributed to those clubs in August and project implementation is underway.

There are 5 District Grant projects from 2019-20 still not completed but are in progress.

Club Training and Club Qualification is underway for club Presidents-Elect and now is the time for clubs to be planning projects for 2021-22. Project submissions are due April 20.

Based on contributions to the Annual Fund in Rotary year 2018-19, we will have approximately \$86,700 available DDF for District Grant projects 2021-22.

Global Grant Activity

Based on 2018-19 Annual Fund contributions, we will have approximately \$86,700 new available DDF for Global Grants and other TRF programs for 2021-22. We should have carry over up to \$82,000 from 20-21 additional for global grants unless new global grant requests come in.

Global Grant GG2011860, a District sponsored Global Grant to fight fetal alcohol syndrome in rural Alaska is in the draft stage of application. This is a reciprocal project partnering with Western Australia District 9455.
