Worldwide Fundraising & the Gates Foundation Matching Grant


Thanks to the support of polio volunteers throughout the world we were able to surpass our fundraising goal of US\$50 million for 2018-19. Total Contributions (as of 30 June) were US\$50.8 million from clubs, districts, and major gifts.

This result means that once again that the Gates Foundation will match 2:1 all Rotary donations.

Our fundraising goal for 2019-20 is to raise US\$50 million for polio through cash, DDF and World Fund match.

Rotary Clubs are encouraged to give an average of US\$1,500 or more to PolioPlus in 2019-20.

Country Updates (as of August 7th, 2019).

The polio eradication program has experienced both progress and challenges in 2019. On 21 August 2019, Nigeria will mark three years without any new cases of the wild poliovirus. As the last polio-endemic country in Africa, Nigeria's success against wild polio will open the door for the entire African region to be certified free of the wild poliovirus. Following the Nigeria 3-year mark, the Africa Regional Certification Commission will finalize its evaluation process of the data to confirm this progress. If the progress is confirmed, the entire African region could be certified WPV-free by mid-2020.



Pakistan and Afghanistan have experienced more cases due to issues including security, resistance, and access challenges. Both governments and polio eradication partners are working to critically analyze their programs and carrying out their national polio emergency plans, and execute area-specific solutions.
