World Polio Day was extra special in Nigeria




This year, World Polio Day was extra special for Rotary members in Nigeria who are celebrating three years of being polio-free!

Nigeria's success against wild polio will open the door for the entire African region to be certified free of the wild poliovirus. The Africa Regional Certification Commission will finalize its evaluation process of the data to confirm this progress. The entire African region could be certified WPV Polio-free during 2020

2 out of 3 Wild Poliovirus Strains Eradicated



In a historic announcement on World Polio Day, an independent commission of experts concluded that wild poliovirus type 3 (WPV3) has been eradicated worldwide. Following the eradication of smallpox and wild poliovirus type 2, this news represents a historic achievement for humanity.

WPV3 is the second strain of the poliovirus to be wiped out, following the certification of the eradication of WPV2 in 2015.
