

As a measure of that success, I am asking each and every Club in the District to achieve DK Lee's presidential citation – not as an honour, although it would certainly be so, but as a testimony of a healthy, vibrant club which is making a difference in the world, in the lives of children. A Club that is Making Dreams Real.


Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses & Professions

The Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions was adopted by the Rotary International Council on Legislation in 1989 to provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for in the Object of Rotary.

As a Rotarian engaged in a business or profession, I am expected to:

- Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve;
- Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country, and to the moral standards of my community;
- Do all in my power to dignify my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation;
- Be fair to my employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public, and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship;
- Recognize the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;
- Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
- Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession;
- Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

Rotary International Structure

Object of Rotary

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Peace Arch District

Although there have been many changes in the areas and nomenclature of our Rotary districts as Rotary expanded into the Pacific Northwest, ours has always been an international district. Rotary first came to the Pacific Northwest when the Seattle Club was founded in 1909 as "Club Number Four" following Chicago, San Francisco, and Oakland. Everett, the oldest club in our district, as presently constituted, was chartered March 1, 1917 as Club Number 272.

Until 1945, Washington, Oregon British Columbia, Alaska and parts of Idaho formed one district (under various numbers including Districts 15, 22, 1, and 102). In 1945 major subdivisions were made on both a North-South and East-West basis. District 101, subsequently 151, of which we are part, emerged and for a time we were the largest geographical district in the world of Rotary.

New subdivisions in 1956 removed Vancouver Island and Washington State, south of the King County line from what now constitutes our district. In 1957 District 151 was redesignated as District 504 with no change in boundaries. In 1973, further changes removed Alaska and the Yukon to a separate district and moved the southern boundary to S.W. 152nd Street in Snohomish County, Washington.

In the succeeding decade, with a dramatic increase in the number of clubs and the extensive distance between the southern and northern clubs, the need for further redistricting became evident. A committee was formed in 1984 to study the problem. After considering several alternatives, a recommendation was submitted to Rotary International to split District 504 into two districts of about 30 clubs each.

The redistricting request was approved in February 1986. On July 1, 1987, District 505 was established with 16 clubs in the State of Washington and 15 clubs in British Columbia. The east, west, and southern boundaries were not changed and the northern boundary was established as being approximately the Fraser River. Despite the separation, our two Districts 5050 and 5040 still enjoy a special relationship with one another and have held joint District Conferences on three occasions (1992, 1994, and 2006).

On July 1, 1991, District 505 became District 5050 as part of the worldwide process of renumbering to accommodate overall growth in the world or Rotary.

Currently there are 55 clubs in District 5050, with a total membership of more than 3,000 Rotarians.

The Governor's & Assistant Governor's Visit & Schedule

Under the District Leadership Plan adopted by District 5050 and promoted by Rotary International, the "Official" visits are conducted by the Assistant Governors. The District Governor will also visit every Club at a regular Club meeting or other Club functions he is invited to attend as his schedule may allow.

Part 1: In the spring of the year, following PETS, the incoming Club President should meet with the Assistant Governor to review materials in the Presidential Manual, formulate his/her goals for the coming year in light of the RI Presidential emphasis, and discuss Club appointments.

Part 2: The second meeting should be set up with Club leadership, including the President-Elect, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Club Directors, for the coming year. This meeting will generally take place in May or June but should occur prior to the start of the new Rotary year. There, a more complete discussion can take place to discuss membership, international service projects, fund raising goals and the Club's budget. Other subjects can be discussed at the discretion of the President and AG.

Part 3: On the day of the Governor's visit, the Governor and Assistant Governor can meet briefly with the President and Club Board prior to or following their regular meeting to discuss further the goals, projects, highlights, or challenges faced by the Club. This meeting is not intended to repeat the agenda of the Board's meeting with the AG but can occur if the President and the Club Board wish.

Note: Should the Club's Officers and Directors wish to meet with the Governor, those arrangements should be made in advance in consultation with the AG.

Important: The District Governor's presentation to the Club is that day's program. No other programs should be scheduled for that day.

These are suggestions and meetings can be arranged to suit each Club and Governor's/AG's schedule. Please contact the District Governor and the AG at least one month prior to the scheduled visit if changes must be made.

Rotary Founders

Paul P. Harris (1868-1947) was a Chicago attorney in 1905 when he had an idea for a club in which professionals could share "mutual cooperation and informal friendship such as all of had once known in our villages." On the evening of Thursday, 23 February 1905, Harris gathered three business acquaintances to form a group that became the Rotary Club of Chicago, initiating the world's first service organization. Harris became the first president of what would later become Rotary International, the association of Rotary clubs around the world with 1.2 million members united under the motto Service Above Self.

Silvester Schiele (1870-1945) was a coal dealer and a client of Paul Harris in 1905. Born in rural Indiana, Schiele liked to tell Harris interesting anecdotes of his "young pioneer" boyhood. During the course of their business dealings, Harris first shared the idea with Schiele for a new kind of club for professionals. On 23 February 1905, Harris invited Schiele for dinner to develop his ideas of a fellowship and booster club. In addition to becoming first president of the Rotary Club of Chicago, Schiele developed a close lifelong friendship with Harris.

Gustavus H. "Gus" Loehr (1864-1918) was a Chicago mining engineer who lent his office on the seventh floor of the Unity Building at 127 Dearborn Street in Chicago for the first gathering of the founders of Rotary on 23 February 1905. Loehr invited Hiram Shorey to this meeting. His health later deteriorated and he left the club, but remained a supporter of Rotary until his death at age 53.

Hiram E. Shorey (1862-1944) was a merchant tailor in 1905. One of the founding four members of the Rotary Club of Chicago, he remained a Rotarian for only a short time before moving back to his home state of Maine. Upon his later return to Chicago, he rejoined for a brief time before resigning again. Despite his brief membership, Shorey was always supportive of the Rotary Club of Chicago and voiced pride at his early association with Rotary.


