

Total funds available	= \$30,000

Global & District Grants - Qualification Requirements

Clubs must qualify to receive Foundation Funds.

The process ensures that clubs are aware of all Rotary requirements and provides clubs with the tools needed to complete the on-line applications.

- ◇ Attend a **Grant Management Seminar** - **Upcoming seminars: January 30, 2021 - BC, February 27, 2021 - WA**
- ◇ Two club members must attend each year
 - ◇ One must be the President Elect
 - ◇ The second should be the club grant writer, club Foundation Chair or the grant writer in training
- ◇ Complete and submit a signed club MOU
- ◇ Clubs are qualified for one year
