Global Grant applications are accepted throughout the year and are reviewed as they are received. They are used to support large international projects with long-term, sustainable outcomes in one or more of Rotary's seven areas of focus. Grant awards range from \$30,000 to \$400,000 USD.

The result of the open all year around process creates a rolling number of grants that are in draft, submitted, approved, & paid status.

TYPES OF GRANTS

The Rotary Foundation offers grants that support humanitarian projects, scholarships, and vocational training teams. Here's an overview:

Global grants support large international projects with long-term, sustainable outcomes in one or more of Rotary's areas of focus. They range from \$30,000 to \$400,000. Applications are accepted throughout the year and are reviewed as they are received.

District grants fund smaller-scale, short-term projects that address immediate needs in your community or abroad. Applications are accepted once per year, deadline August 31 of each year.

Clubs must qualify to receive Foundation Funds.

The process ensures that clubs are aware of all Rotary requirements and provides clubs with the tools needed to complete the on-line applications.

Qualification Requirements

- ◆ Attend a Grant Management Seminar
 - ◆ Two club members must attend each year
 - ◇ One must be the President Elect
 - ◇ The second should be the club grant writer, club Foundation Chair or the grant writer in training
- ◆ Complete and submit a signed club MOU
- ◆ Clubs are qualified for one year
- ◆ Members that attend the Grant Management Seminar and sign a MOU are qualified for three years
