Months 4-6	 Engage them in thinking about how best to fit into Club structure longer term – Board, events, organising, fund raising Seek ideas on new approaches for Club Encourage Creative thinking e.g. fund raising ideas Follow-up absences
Months 7-12	 Engage occasionally to ensure they are happy in Rotary Involve them
