## Message from the District Governor

Fellow Rotarians,

My first month as a District Governor was relatively quiet, at least on the Rotary front. My club and I received the "Home of the District Governor" banner on July 15<sup>th</sup>, as PDG Larry actually seemed pleased to hand it along. I appreciated receiving the official District Governor pin from him that evening as well. I have completed my three official visits scheduled in July, and participated in the Aldergrove Fair parade, turning the large Rotary wheel on loan from PDG Harv.

The big event for Arlene and me was our daughter Alison giving birth on July 11<sup>th</sup> to our first grandchild. Katrina Alyse has now come into our lives, and she is a little darling. You can see from my picture with her that her grandpa is very pleased.

Holding this beautiful little girl in my arms, I thought about how much she will be learning, how much she will experience as she grows, how I hope she will have much joy in her life. Her future is bright, and I want to be a big part of helping her along the way. She is one of the fortunate ones, born here, in a country with a good medical system, with good housing, with plenty of food and fresh water, and with the opportunity for education and freedom in life. Not all children are so lucky.

I wrote last month that eradicating polio remains Rotary's #1 priority and challenge, and that we are getting ever closer to achieving our goal. Recent outbreaks of cases in Tajikistan show how perilous our mission is, and how we must persevere to stamp out this disease. I believe that migration of people from an endemic area led to the new outbreak of the wild polio virus. Twelve new cases were reported in that previously polio-free country in the past week, bringing the total number of cases for 2010 to 425. The most recent case had onset of paralysis on June 12, and has been covered by the most recent National Immunization Day (NID) on June 15. Four NIDs have now been conducted with mOPV1 at short intervals.

To minimize the risk and consequences of international spread of polio from Tajikistan, in July and August Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan are all conducting NIDs.

Last month I urged clubs and Rotarians to support Golfun, our district fundraiser for Polio Plus, and you can see that the need for increased vaccinations is very real. We all can do our part to contribute to the cause and help the many volunteers distribute the life-altering and life-saving medications to less-fortunate children in this world.

We have had a much lower than expected volume of requests for matching grants from our clubs this year. We felt we did not need a Foundation Seminar in July; perhaps we were wrong. Foundation Chair Bill Robson and District Trainer Cheryl McKeever are now planning a seminar, for our district. The information will soon be coming your way.

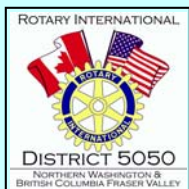
Eric plans to send updates of the travels bi-monthly to be included in the PAJ, so please remember to provide him with the necessary information.

**Rotary Theme for August: Membership & Retention**

**Bigger, Better, Bolder!**

As the 2010 RI Convention in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, drew to a close on 23 June, RI President-elect Ray Klinginsmith outlined his plans for his term, which begins 1 July. Klinginsmith will ask Rotarians to apply "cowboy logic" and make Rotary clubs "bigger, better, and bolder."

The fundamental principles of cowboy logic are taking pride in your work, talking less and saying more, doing what has to be done, and remembering that some things just aren't for sale, as he explained during the plenary session.

"I believe the way for Rotary to remain viable and vibrant in the next century is to help our clubs to be bigger, better, and bolder," Klinginsmith said. "The clubs are the life and breath of Rotary. Therefore, it is clear to me that my job is to help the district governors to help the clubs. We can do it, and we will do it, if all of us follow the simple solution of cowboy logic."

Klinginsmith also listed improvements that he and the RI Board have already authorized, including revisions to the RI Strategic Plan to make it easier to implement and evaluate, a realignment of RI committees to fit the revised plan, the recruitment of 41 Rotary coordinators, and a commitment to finding new ways to attract younger members and enable them to serve as district governors.

On Friday and Saturday, July 10 and 11, 2010, four groups, including 17 from the Rotary Club of Bellingham, climbed Mt. Baker (located 31 miles/50 km east of the city of Bellingham and a prominence of 8,812 feet). They were led by Richard Tucker, a world-class climber who is a member of the club. The ages of the climbers ranged from 40s to 70s. The mostly cooperative weather stayed warm until they reached the summit. The teams met at the summit plateau for a brief picture before going their separate ways.



The climbers hit the trail Friday morning. They arrived at base camp after seven hours of hard hiking past the snow line. The Rotarians left their base camp at 3:00 a.m. on Saturday morning and triumphantly walked into the cloud and winds clinging to the top of the mountain.

During the climb the teams traversed their way across the magnificent Coleman Glacier and up the Roman Wall. The warmer weather on the way down required long sleeves and/or the regular application of sunscreen, to keep from burning, and caused the slushy snow to challenge the traverse. The hikers often stepped in snow, sinking up to their knees and their hips. After completing a 16½ hour day of strenuous hiking, the final team returned successfully to the trailhead at 7:30 pm on Saturday evening.

For many of those participating, the climb was a once-in-a-lifetime "bucket list" activity. Congratulations, Rotarian climbers! Well done!

I drove up to Stanwood on Wednesday, July 21, 2010, to attend their weekly noon meeting in the board room of the Stanwood School District and to see their new *Rotary Adventure Playground*. During the meeting Terry Greer displayed some of the traveling club banners that he was given during the 2010 Rotary International Convention in Montreal, Quebec.

The program speaker, Tracy McMillan, shared about a State of Washington's program focused on making highways less lethal by reducing DUIs (Driving Under Influence).

It was delightful to be able to meet the Stanwood-Camano Island Rotarian, Greg Gilday, who was the person who had the vision for a kids playground. Following Greg's club meeting he accompanied me on a beautiful day to see the very recently completed *Rotary Adventure Playground*.

Greg is an attorney who was born and still lives in the Stanwood area with his wife, Megan, and two young sons, Laker and Graham. He told me that he had been inspired by the Million Smiles Playground in Lynden, Washington, and thought just how great it would be for a kids park that his boys could enjoy. With that vision in his head, Greg began talking about the idea to anyone who would take the time to listen, including local groups and business who had property.

The vision of one Rotarian became a reality in May when many individuals, businesses, and organizations came together and built the playground on private property owned by the Freedom Park Association, which includes a Pearl Harbor Day Memorial. The playground was built by a volunteer crew of over 1,000 people over a five day period.

On May 21, 2010, Marysville Sunrise Rotary Club President, Doug Newman, wrote to Area J Assistant Governor, Lee Harman, "tomorrow at Terry's Corner we are assisting Stanwood Camano Rotary club finishing the community project. I'm thinking that there will be a need to spread bark, plant shrubs, etc. If you have some tools, bring them as I understand that they are a little short of tools....Thanks for your service - See you there!!"

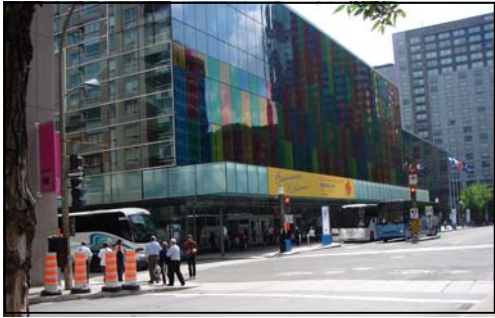
Greg has written: "AMAZING. That is the word that comes to mind when I think how our community came together to build the Rotary Adventure Playground. We had more than 1,000 volunteers come out to work with their neighbors, to saw, paint, swing a hammer, drive screws and push wheelbarrows, I was amazed at how I repeatedly saw contractors instructing the non-experienced volunteers so everyone had a chance to build a piece of the playground. I was amazed at how, when all was said and done, how smoothly everything went. While I may have had the idea, without a fabulous group of committed individuals working on this, the idea never would have moved forward."
