Qualification Requirements

- ♦ Attend a Grant Management Seminar (GMS)
- ♦ Two club members must attend each year
 - ♦ One must be the President Elect
 - ♦ The second should be the member that would normally complete the on-line application
- ♦ Complete and submit a signed club MOU
- ♦ Clubs are qualified for one year
- Members that attend the GMS are qualified for two years

1	Abbotsford	Living Units revitalization - to refurbish the suites including new floors, drywall in some suites and painting throughout at the Supportive Living Suites.	Abbotsford	\$3,450
2	Anacortes	Disk Golf Course - Fund and build a community disk golf course adjacent to our Rotary Park.	Anacortes	\$2,536
3	Burlington Mid-Day	2nd Grade Book Project - purchase books for all 2nd grade students in the Burlington-Edison School District, about 350-400 students from the 5 elementary schools.	Burlington	\$1,500
4	Chilliwack	Rotary Park Extension - to further extend the currently incomplete trail system in the Wetland, to develop site-specific interactive and educational signage, and to add railings for safety reasons to the Bergman bridge.	Chilliwack	\$6,500
