(PEs & Incoming Club Leaders)

Pre-Assignment

I. TESTING ACCESS & GETTING FAMILIAR WITH CLUB CENTRAL

This pre-assignment will test your Club Central access to ensure you have capabilities you need as an incoming club officer, and help you with a brief introduction to Club Central before the training session. It will take about 15 minutes to complete Part I. Part II contains resources for you and your club leaders.

This pre-assignment will also help us to understand if you have the access needed before our training session. Please let us know at least one day in advance of training if you are having access issues. It can sometimes take several days to solve access dilemmas, so the sooner you let us know, the faster we can point you in the right direction.

Log into My Rotary Under My Club Snapshot (left panel) Click View Goals Review data for your own club in the 3 indicator tabs.

A. Your Club Tab

Has your club set goals for the current year in all indicators? Has your club entered "Year to Date" progress reports for this year? What was the number of members on July 1? What is it today? What is your club's current retention percentage? In what age category are the majority of your members? Are there any areas in membership that are "unreported?"

Click Reports

Review reports available to you under Club Reports (based on access level; will be additional reports added on 1 July if you are changing roles)

B. Service Tab How many current service projects are entered and have progress reports?

C. Foundation Tab

Review Annual Fund contributions for the past 5 years. What is the trend? Are goals entered for all Foundation indicators for 14-15?

Click "edit." Are you able to enter/edit information (if you wanted to enter information today)? NOTE: this will be functional only if you are a current officer and are registered with Rotary as a current officer. Click the 15-16 tab. Are you able to enter information? (You will be able to edit/enter if you will be a 15-16 board member * and you are registered as such with Rotary; you will be able to edit 14-15 if you are currently one of the board members and registered as such with RI)

* Incoming, current and immediate past president, secretary, treasurer, executive secretary, TRF chair and membership chair as registered with RI for the year they hold office can view and edit. All members can see goals and achievements.

D. Click Club Group View (left menu)

Can you see a summary of the clubs in your area (if you are a current leader as described above)? Can you see the clubs in your area if you click the 14-15 tab (if you are a 14-15 board member as described above) These are the clubs by "AG Area."

E. Click District View (left menu) Can you see a summary of the clubs in your district?

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F. Return to My Rotary (leave Rotary Club Central) Review the terminated member list for your own club, if possible (full reports available if registered as a club officer or director)

Note: exact path may vary slightly based on your level of access

Click Manage (link at bottom of page) Click Club & District Administration

Go to Reports section Review Member Data - Club - Click Club Information

- Click Members

- Click Terminated Members

Note: the above reports are available to current presidents and secretaries/executive secretaries; if you cannot access them now, you may wish to work with your president or secretary for a current copy.
