 - Setting minimum distances between people (though at this time it is recommended that no groups come together)
 - Cleaning Protocols
 - Hand washing
 - Masks worn
 - Wear gloves
 - Sanitizing surfaces regularly

- 3. Find new ways to fundraise and plan activities people can do on their own from their homes, computers or phones.
 - When cancelling an event and offering a refund on the registration fee, simply ask the question:
 - "Unfortunately we have to cancel our event, but our community is going need our compassion as a Rotary District/Club now more than ever, please let us know if you would like a full refund, or if you are willing and able to donate any portion of the registration fees to our community fund. Options can range from a \$10 donation to the full amount of the registration."
 - Run an Online Philanthropy campaign and ask for a sizeable amount \$100 (then put in brackets for people to donate whatever they can afford.)
 - Run an old fashion Telethon. Advertise the dates and times, put together a committee to call 20 people each. Ask people to donate what they can.

There is an incredible amount of not for profit organizations that are going to be in very hard times starting now, and to team up with one of them in your community would get your donors tax receipts.

Lastly, be sure to pick up the phone and call some of our fellow Rotarians that are isolated due to mobility, age or compromised immune systems. They are hunkering down more than many, and a call would likely make all the difference in the world to these friends on quiet and potentially lonely nights.

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
