Rotary District 5080 and The Rotaract Club of the Palouse supports Malden/Pine City for the Holidays

PULLMAN, WA/ MOSCOW, ID — Rotary District 5080 and The Rotaract Club of the Palouse supported families impacted by the fires in Malden and Pine City with a clothing drive and gift card fundraiser.

"Our Rotaract Club is comprised of students from the University of Idaho and Washington State University as well as community members," said Rotaract Club President Katrina Barlass. "It is important for us to come together with Rotary and with our members to support these communities with our efforts."

In November, the club collected new and gently used clothing and was awarded two small grants through Rotary District 5080 partnerships to provide \$650 in gift cards to local businesses. Purchasing items from the list of needs on the Whitman County Sheriff's website, the group was able to take a carload of new and gently used items along with gift cards for groceries to the United Way of Whitman County for distribution.

The Rotaract Club of the Palouse is a youth-based Rotary Club, sponsored by the Rotary Clubs of Moscow Idaho and Pullman Washington. Rotary District 5080 is based in parts of Washington/Idaho and British Columbia B.C. Cash funds were collected through the Rotary District Community Service fund.

- As of January 20...here are some very wonderful pieces of news about how GENEROUS our members have been this year:

- We are 1 of only 3 Districts in our two zones (26 & 27) that has 100% of our clubs submitting a GOAL for the Annual Fund YAHOO
- We are 1 of 5 in our Zone 27 (and 1 of 11 in the combined two zones) to be reporting a +ve status for our donations on Year-to-date YAHOO
- We are below the average in the two zones in our average per capita donation to the Annual Fund (YTD) but we're above where we were last year's TD.
- We have had 715 individual members donate at least \$1 to the Annual Fund YTD (but sadly that's 3rd lowest of the 30 districts).
