DISTRICT LEVEL COMPETITION INSTRUCTIONS

Rotary Clubs: Please complete the steps below ONLY for students that are advancing to competition on March 8, 2025.

PAYMENT

 - Small Clubs (20 members or less): \$100 per contest
 - Medium Clubs (21-49 members): \$160 per contest
 - Large Clubs (50+ members): \$210 per contest

GENERAL CONTEST RULES FOR ALL CONTESTS AND CONTESTANTS

Location, arrival time and performance/presentation times will be sent prior to the contest.

• The Pageant of the Arts is an annual competition for high school students:

- There are five separate contests Art, Dance, Speech, Instrumental Music and Vocal Music.
- Separate rules and applications apply for each contest.
- Only one contestant per Rotary Club may be sent to the Art and Speech Contests.
- Clubs may enter soloists or groups for Dance and Music.

• Contestants must:

- Be currently enrolled in high school, home-schooled, or an alternative program;
- Of high school age;
- Have won 1st place at a Rotary Club Contest or may be sponsored by a Rotary Club.

• Contestants may enter more than one contest if:

- The contestant qualifies;
- Has the sponsorship of a Rotary Club.
- Note: Separate rules and application apply for each contest.

• Prizes for each contest:

• 1st Place - \$1,000.00; 2nd Place - \$500.00; 3rd Place - \$250.00.

• The Contestant Registration & Parent/Guardian Consent Form must be:

- Signed by the contestant and their parent/guardian;
- Submitted to your sponsoring Rotary Club.
- The Rotary Club will register contestants online and pay the entry fee.
- o Deadline for this is February 24, 2025.

• Judges are experts in their field:

- A Judging Rubric is used in evaluating contestants;
- The rubric is available from your Rotary Club, the Contest Chair, or the Rotary District 5280 website.

SPEECH CONTEST RULES

- Speech Topic: "Doing Good In The World" (The motto of The Rotary Foundation).
- As a contestant, you should structure a speech that explains, promotes or clarifies how this theme is a positive solution to life's challenges. You may choose a challenge within the nation, state, community, school, family or a personal challenge and apply "Doing Good In The World" as the message of the speech.
- Speech content must be original to the contestant. Quotes may be used but must be limited to 10% or less of the speech.
- All performances/presentations/exhibits must be live, in person at the venue.
- Speech must not be read or delivered from notes. One 3"x5" note card will be allowed.
- Speech must be between 4 to 6 minutes. Timing cards will be shown at 4 minutes, 5 minutes, and 6 minutes. There is a grace period of 15 seconds. At 6 minutes 15 seconds they will be asked to stop.
- Speaking order is determined by randomization.
- The winner will be announced the day of the contest.
