It's the night before and each child has their clothes laid out. For several days prior, the question was, "what should I wear?" Mom and Dad have taken them shopping for clothes to wear for their return back to school. The anticipation is building. It is morning and they scramble to dress and be ready. Lunch boxes are prepared. And off they go in tow with Mom and Dad to their first day of the school year. This is as much a tradition as apple pie and baseball.

Everyone recognizes the importance of education and literacy. Recent studies reveal 36 million adults struggle with low literacy. That's one in every six adults in the United States. But, in a recent public opinion poll, 70% of respondents claim they do not personally know someone with low literacy. In reality, they probably do. Adult literacy has an awareness issue.

This month Rotary International brings attention to education and literacy. Supporting education is one of Rotary's six areas of focus. How can you help? Club members can pair with young students for

mentorship. Members can go to the local library and read stories to children. We can share our knowledge and experience with educators and other professionals who work with vulnerable communities. Rotarians can combat adult literacy by collaborating with local advocates to offer community literacy programs. And there is so much more we can do.

Once there was a man born in the early 1900's. In the remote ranchlands there was not a school or teachers. He grew up functionally illiterate. Later in years whenever a document had to be signed by him, he usually placed an "x" on the line and asked a family member to sign his name for him. This because he believed his writing skills were poorly unacceptable. I remember signing his name on the line with an "x". He was my father.

Together, we can empower and inspire others of all ages, to learn. Be the inspiration.

On what would have been Matt's 42nd birthday, December 1, his Mother, Judy, will be the feature speaker and facilitator as we learn how we can take away hate.


You will leave this forum with action items that you can put into place, immediately by yourself or with your club that will serve to reduce incidences of hate in your community.


