Appendix B

Rules and Conditions of Exchange

As a New Generation Service Exchange student sponsored by a Rotary club or district, you must agree to the following rules and conditions of this exchange. Violation of any of these rules may result in dismissal from the program.

- 1. Prohibited Behaviors that will result in immediate termination of the virtual exchange:
 - a. **Cyber Bullying**. Cyber Bullying is the use of the Internet and related technologies to harm other people in a deliberate, hostile and often repeated manner.
 - b. **Identity Theft**. Identity theft is a form of stealing someone's identity in which someone pretends to be someone else by assuming that person's identity.
 - c. **Posting or sharing sexually oriented materials**. This includes texts, stories, images, photos, videos, graphics, etc.
 - d. **Uploading viruses or malware**. A computer virus is a computer program that can replicate itself and spread from one computer to another. Malware includes but is not limited to adware and spyware programs that do not have reproductive ability.
- 2. Rotary International is a global service organization comprised of people from many countries. Our members have different religious and political beliefs. Therefore, Rotary International and its global network of districts and clubs are explicitly secular and apolitical and do not promote or endorse any religious or political views.
- 3. Make every effort to participate in all planned exchange program activities.
- 4. Report anything that makes you feel uncomfortable, for any reason, including the treatment of others online or receiving inappropriate messages or images from anyone. Participants should report concerns to the Rotary members listed on the Sponsor Club & District Endorsement form listed in Section C of this application.

Appendix C

Tips for a Successful Exchange

- 1. Make an effort to learn the basics of the language of the host country.
- 2. It is always good to be cautious while on the Internet. There are people in the cyber world who want to do harm to you or your computer. The following website has useful safety information: https://staysafe.org/teens.
- 3. Be aware that anything you share and post on the Internet will be there permanently.
- 4. Remain cautious about whom you interact with on the Internet.
- 5. Understand that personal information on social networks can easily be accessed by anyone. Be sure to turn off your GPS tracking and refrain from posting your location.
- 6. Do not open any links in emails or chat rooms that look suspicious or unfamiliar. Never open any strange files that your computer may have downloaded from an email or a website.
- 7. Be punctual, be committed, be grateful and be an ambassador.
- 8. Exhibit good manners, avoid negative language and maintain goodwill.
- 9. When invited, attend Rotary meetings, be prepared to make a presentation to the members (to be a guest speaker), engage in Club service projects as appropriate, and show an interest in the Club, its members and its activities.
