All club presidents were provided with an official notice of the Redistricting request of the Rotary Clubs of Whitehorse. The 30-day timeline passed without any objections. I have notified Rotary International with an official request to transfer the Rotary Club of Whitehorse and the Rotary Club of Whitehorse Rendezvous including the Yukon Territory to District 5370. I have also requested to waive the two-year waiting period ensuring that the transfer become effective July 1, 2019.
