wild animals and quiet solitude entice visitors. My first glimpse of Whitehorse was from the air, where I saw an emerald green river winding through dense forest alongside rugged cliffs. I was greeted warmly by representatives of the Whitehorse clubs who will be joining our District. They are friendly, knowledgeable individuals, passionate about their community, with shared commitment to service, an eagerness to learn and a willingness to collaborate. I anticipate that with the Yukon becoming part of our District, travelling north will be added to several bucket lists!

### **May Shines a Light on Youth Programs!**



Our District has more than 1,500 young leaders active in our youth programs and we are unique in having young leaders in key positions leading their programs, with the assistance and support of Rotarian advisors. I had the pleasure of attending the RYPEN planning meeting and was impressed by the enthusiasm, energy and serious preparation in advance of the weekend! For the first time we will have almost 70 students attending the weekend at the Birch Bay ranch! Thank you to RYPEN chair Yvone Joubert (Rotaract Club of MacEwan University), Rotarian advisors Darren Chin, (Rotary Club of Edmonton-Whyte Avenue), and Lesa Mueller (Parkland after Dark), and Youth Chair Tamara Larson (Edmonton-Whyte Avenue). RYLE Camp with 65 campers at Camp Nakamun will focus on interpersonal growth, communication, community building and global citizenship.

<u>Smith</u> is currently enrolled in a master's program at the University of Queensland.

We have one of the largest youth programs in our Zone, with 250 Rotaractors in nine clubs, 50 Interact clubs, one Early Act club, 10 international exchange students and numerous opportunities for youth to participate in other programs like the Adventures in Citizenship program in Ottawa and the Human Rights Leadership Experience at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights in Winnipeg. A huge thank you to all clubs who support and encourage youth programs in our District! Through your participation we are ensuring our future!



## **Council on Legislation**

Thank you to Past District Governor and Zone Coordinator Jackie Hobal, who attended the Council on Legislation in Chicago as our District representative. There, 117 amendments were reviewed and voted on, including the status of Rotaract clubs. The change broadens the definition of membership in Rotary to

include Rotaract clubs. The tax status of Rotary International may change, which will offer benefits that include tax reductions and some vendor discounts. Read <u>highlights of the Council on</u> <u>Legislation</u>.

## **End Polio Now Update**

Zone 24's End Polio Now coordinator is our own Past District Governor, Linda Robertson, who provides current information to all 17 Districts in our zone. Currently we are encountering some challenges in Pakistan with resistance to the immunization process and volunteer workers. These challenges are being addressed by Rotary leaders to bring about resolution.

May and June are the months we see District clubs fulfil their goals for membership and support for Polio Plus. Several clubs have yet to send in their donation. Please check with your Assistant Governor if you need information or assistance. Top five reasons to eradicate polio: **1. Improve lives:** 16 million people are walking today who would have otherwise been paralyzed.

**2. Invest in the future**: If polio isn't eradicated, within 10 years as many as 200,000 children could be paralyzed annually. A polio-free world will be a safer world for children everywhere.

**3. Improve child health**: Polio surveillance networks and vaccination campaigns also monitor children for other health problems like vitamin deficiency and measles, so they can be addressed sooner.

4. **Save money:** A polio-free world will save the global economy \$40-50 billion in health-care costs within 20 years.

5. **Make history:** Polio eradication would be one of history's greatest public health achievements, with polio following smallpox as only the second human disease eliminated.

## **Empire State Building Tower Run**

A unique opportunity to donate any amount to End Polio Now is to support the Empire State Building Tower Run in New York May 14.

Clive Burke has been accepted into the iconic tower run, which is limited to 225 participants from around the world who climb the 86 flights of stairs



(1,576 steps), from lobby to observation deck.

The event is so popular that a lottery draw chooses 200 of the 225 athletes.

Clive has dedicated his run to help End Polio Now. Thanks to Sean Draper of the Rotary Club of Edmonton Northeast and Linda Robertson for setting up the <u>website</u>. Many thanks to all members who have already donated. We have donations from members of the general public due to the <u>Edmonton Journal</u> <u>article</u> published recently.

Indonesian Rotarians prepare to celebrate 20th anniversary of the life-saving Bali Blood Bank, built with support of District 5370 clubs

The claim that Rotarysupported programs and projects save lives can be difficult to prove at times, but in the case of a 1999



project in Indonesia, the evidence is indisputable.

The Bali Blood Bank, the building of which was supported in part by 18 clubs from our District, saved lives.

"When in 2002 a terrorist bombing rocked Bali, the Rotaryfunded Bali Blood Bank was instrumental in saving many victims' lives," writes Karl-Heinz Schmelzer (RC of Bali Nusa Dua) in an email to our District.

The attack killed 190 and injured hundreds more.

"If it was not for the blood bank, things would have been very much worse," Freddy Subiyanto (RC of Bali Denpasar) is quoted as saying in an article in the December 2002 issue of *The Rotarian*.
