2022 – 2023 District Awards Criteria for Rotary and Rotaract Clubs

The following awards will be presented at the 2022 - 2023 District Conference being held April 20 – 23, 2023 at the Jasper Park Lodge. Submit your nomination to office@rotary5370.org with the subject line of District Awards.

Deadline for Submissions is March 29, 2023.

Eligible entries may be a project you have started, worked on, or completed in this Rotary year. Submission should include a written description, pictures and other supporting materials. An entry may be submitted for only one category.

Governor's Award – Reflection of the Rotary International Theme

This award is presented to the Rotary or Rotaract club that has most clearly reflected the Rotary International Theme – *Imagine Rotary*. Describe how your club has reflected this theme.

Community Service Award

This award recognizes a Rotary or Rotaract Club for exemplary programs, or projects related to one or more of Rotary's *7 Areas of Focus* that achieve sustainable change to the lives of community members.

International Service Award

This award recognizes a Rotary or Rotaract club for exemplary programs, or projects that change the lives of people in other countries in sustainable ways related to one or more of Rotary's *7 Areas of Focus*.

Youth Service Award

This award recognizes a Rotary or Rotaract club for exemplary programs, and projects related to one or more of Rotary's *7 Areas of Focus* that supports youth in need, either locally or international.

Public Image Award

This award recognizes a Rotary or Rotaract club for its planned approach to internal and external communications that utilize a variety of tools and techniques to increase awareness of Rotary and their club.

Membership Growth Award

This award recognizes a Rotary or Rotaract Club that demonstrates a planned approach to increase membership.

Club Fellowship Award

This award recognizes the Rotary or Rotaract club that held a most unique, exciting, and/or innovative fellowship event for its members and friends.

Rotary Foundation Fundraising Award

This award recognizes a club that develops and implements a strategy that results in an increase in its per capita giving to the Annual Fund.

End Polio Now Fundraising Award

This award recognizes a club that develops and implements a strategy that results in an increase in its per capita giving to the *End Polio Now* fund.

Membership Growth Award

This award recognizes a Rotary or Rotaract club that demonstrated a planned approach to increase membership.

Vinny Jacques – RYLE Award

A certificate for one student's registration next year is given to a single club sending the largest number of participants to the RYLE camp this year.

Vinny Jacques – RYPEN Award

A certificate for one student's registration next year is given to a single club sending the largest number of participants to the RYPEN camp this year.

The following awards winners will be determined after the June 30th year end numbers are released from Rotary International.

Annual Membership Growth Award

This award recognizes the club that achieves the greatest net percentage increase in active membership during the Rotary year.

Annual Foundation Fund Award

This award is presented to the club whose members made the highest per capita contribution to the TRF Annual Fund during the Rotary Year.

End Polio Now Award

This award is presented to the club whose members made the highest per capita contribution to the End Polio Now fund during the Rotary Year.

The following award winner is determined by Alberta Inclusion.

Frank Devlyn Award

This award is presented annually to the club which creates meaningful employment opportunities at a rate greater than 5% of club membership for individuals with developmental disabilities.
