



District 5370 Foundation Giving & Foundation Goals



Total Giving: \$2.05M USD (average \$292,700/year)

<u>Total DDF Allocation</u>: \$1.02M USD (average \$145,400/yr) FOUNDATION

Per capita Giving in 2022-23: \$164USD (40% members)


Goal 1: District Double-up Campaign - from 40% member giving to 80%

<u>Impacts</u>: doubles up the hope we can create at home and world, by doubling the DDF we receive for *District & Global Grants*

Goal 2: Increase Club participation in Global Grant Projects

<u>Impacts</u>: creating hope in the world through Global Grants





GRANT TYPES?


- District Grants
- Global Grants
- Disaster response grants
- Programs of scale awards

- Fund larger, longer projects with sustainable, measurable results
- <u>3 types</u>: humanitarian, scholarships, vocational training teams
- Align with our areas of focus
- Include international partners (Rotary and non-Rotary)
- Both sponsors need to be qualified
- Have a \$30,000US minimum budget
- Receive an 80% match from the World Fund for DDF (only).



ROTARY'S AREAS OF FOCUS

- Peacebuilding and conflict prevention
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water, sanitation, and hygiene
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Community economic development
- Environment



For Rotary, sustainability means providing **SUSTAINABILITY** long-term solutions to community problems that community members themselves can support after the grant funding ends. Start with the community Identify a need and develop a solution that builds on community strengths and aligns with local values and culture. **Encourage local ownership** Identify key community members who can help pioneer lasting improvements **Provide training** A project's success depends on people **Buy local** Purchase equipment and technology from local sources. Find local funding Get local funding through governments, hospitals, companies, and other organizations. Measure your success Develop clear and measurable project outcomes and determine how you will collect your data.

SUSTAINABILITY

- Means different things to different organizations.
- For Rotary, it means implementing long-term solutions to local needs that the community can maintain after the grant funding ends.





GLOBAL GRANT FUNDING POLICY 2024-2025

- \$1 for \$1 match up to \$10,000 USD per Club per Rotary year (not per project): subject to change based on demand and funding availability.
- Direct cash contributions from Club members to TRF (once GG project approved) count as part of matching.
- Applications for the DDF match for GG Projects accepted on a first come basis.
- D5370 DDF for Global Grant Projects in 2024-25 is more than \$100,000USD

D5370 Global Grant Projects:

53 grants / projects

23 countries

6 continents

D5370 Club Participation:

19 Clubs as Project Leads & Funders

20 Clubs as Project Funding Partners

21 Clubs <u>yet to participate</u>

Project Funding (USD):

Total Value of \$8.3 million Club Funds of \$805,250 D5370 DDF of \$433,645 World Fund of \$2.7 million



Summary:

- Huge success & positive impacts
- Number of projects has decreased
- Opportunity to <u>create more hope!!</u>



- 1. Preliminary Project Identification & Planning (6-12 months + / -)
- 2. Project Promotions, Fundraising, & Application (6-12 months + / -)
- 3.GG Application Submission & Approval (up to 6 months + / -)
- 4. Project Implementation (average 2 years no limit)
- 5. Project Final Reporting & Sharing Success (2-6 months + / -)
- 6. Monitoring, Evaluation & Follow-up Reporting (6-12 months + / -)
