APPROXIMATELY 795 MILLION PEOPLE IN THE WORLD ARE CHRONICALLY MALNOURISHED.

That number is down 167 million over the past decade and 216 million less than in 1990-1992.



The latest estimates show that the proportion of **PEOPLE LIVING ON LESS THAN** ^{\$}**1.25 A DAY FELL** from 43.6 percent in 1990 to 17.0 percent in 2011.

Forecasts based on countryspecific growth rates in the past 10 years indicate that the extreme poverty rate will fall to 13.4 percent by 2015, a drop of more than twothirds from the baseline.
