PolioPlus Weekly Update



21 June, 2023

Note: This update is going out to all Zone 26 & 27 DG's, DGE's, DGN's, District Foundation Chairs, District PolioPlus Chairs, Senior Leaders and others who hav

e requested to be on the mailing list 😊. However, If you wish to no longer receive these updates, please let me know and I'll remove you from the list.

- WILD POLIO VIRUS, TYPE 1 (WPV1) One new case of WPV1 was reported on the 18th of May in Nangarhar Province, Afghanistan, making this their 5th case this year, all occurring in this one Province.
 - **THIRTY-FOUR** The number of days since the last case of WPV1 occurred in Afghanistan (May 18th, 2023).
 - **ONE HUNDRED & TWENTY-ONE -** The number of days since the last case of WPV1 occurred in Pakistan (February 20th, 2023).
- THREE HUNDRED & FIFTEEN (10 MONTHS +) The number of days since the last case of WPV1 occurred in Mozambique (August 10th, 2022).
- **SIX** The number of WPV1 cases reported for the year **2023** (1 in Pakistan and 5 in Afghanistan).
- **THIRTY** The total number of WPV1 cases that occurred in **2022** (2 in Afghanistan, 8 in Mozambique and 20 in Pakistan).
- SIX The total number of WPV1 cases that occurred in **2021** (1 in Pakistan, 1 in Malawi and 4 in Afghanistan).
- ONE HUNDRED & FORTY Total number of WPV1 cases that occurred in 2020.

There were NO new Positive Wild Environmental Samples of WPV1 reported last week. So the 2023 year's total remains at 40 Positive Environmental Samples (29 in Afghanistan and 11 in Pakistan). The total count of Positive Wild Samples for 2022 remains at 63 (41 in Pakistan and 22 in Afghanistan).

• CIRCULATING VACCINE-DERIVED POLIO - On our other battlefront in the war on polio, the circulating Vaccine-Derived Polio, there were 5 cases of cVDP reported this last week compared to 23 cases the week before. Madagascar had 3 Positive Type 1 cases reported this week, but one actually occurred in 2022. Benin and Mali each had one case reported, all Type 2,. So the 2023 year's total increases to 117, and the 2022 case total increases to 864.

There was one Positive Vaccine Derived Environmental Sample (ES) of Type 1 reported last week from Madagascar. So the total for 2023 increases to 88 and the 2022 count remains at 460.

• UPDATE ON THE FLIGHT TO END POLIO - 7 Weeks ago we Introduced Flying Rotarians John Ockenfels and Peter Teahen, who are circumnavigating the earth in a light airplane to raise awareness and funds for our fight against polio. All funds donated go directly to PolioPlus as they are financing this trip via sponsorships and out of their own pockets. To find out more about their adventure, go to flighttoendpolio.com. According to to their latest email update, Peter's bout with dehydration last week was a little more serious then reported. What we just found out is that he was hospitalized in Goa and pumped full of fluids and medications to bring him back to health. And yes, he is fine now. Here's a short video of Peter on his discharge from the hospital...and all this occurring on his birthday, no less ...

Being delayed a few days due to his hospitalization, they left Nagpur, India last Friday via commercial jet to Colombo, Sri Lanka, so they could make their planned events there, while the aircraft stayed in India. After the planned events, they returned to Nagpur where they picked up their aircraft and flew back to Colombia... Pant, pant, pant. The next day they continued onto Phuket, Thailand, spent the night there, and today, Sunday, they landed in Suban Jaya, Malaysia. Their next stop is Bali, Indonesia.



Poliovirus Weekly Update 21 June, 2023, World Health Organization

You will see below, that the number of wild polio cases for 2023 as of June 21st is 6 (5 in Afghanistan and 1 in Pakistan).

You will also see that the 2022 count remains at 30 (2 in Afghanistan, 20 in Pakistan and 8 in Mozambique).

The total number of wild polio cases in **2021** were **6** (1 in Pakistan, 1 in Malawi and 4 in Afghanistan).

The total number of wild polio cases in **2020** were **140** (84 in Pakistan and 56 in Afghanistan).

The total number of wild polio cases in **2019** were **176** (147 in Pakistan and 29 in Afghanistan).

cVDPV = Circulating Vaccine Derived Poliovirus (a 1 or 2 behind it denotes the polio type...ie cVDPV2)

ES = Positive Environmental Samples
