

ANNUAL GIVING BETTER THAN PREDICTIED

Congratulations 08-09 Rotary Club presidents and club members. As June 30, 2009 and based on data at RI web site, our district exceeded our pledge of \$144,735.00. The amount we as a district contributed to The Rotary Foundation (TRF) for the Rotary Year 08-

DISTRICT RISK MANAGEMENT REMINDER

Our District has had a Risk Management Plan in place for several vears now and each club should have a Risk Management Officer. It is easy to add that person to the club committee list on the District Web site or on your club's site (for those with ClubRunner). This is the one member of your club who is the go -to person should an allegation of abuse or harassment occur and they are responsible for taking care of background check applications for members and other volunteers.

Who needs to have a background check done? If your club is involved in Youth Exchange, this includes all family members in

the host home who are 18 or older, counselors, and chaperones. For RYLA, all adult camp volunteers, adults (other than the camper's parents or immediate family) who transport the students to camp. For Interact, all advisors and any volunteer adult who may be in a one-on-one situation with a student. Other areas that fall under the background check requirement are scholarship committee members if interviews are not done as a group; Rotary sponsored sports programs (coaches); volunteers in programs for the elderly or handicapped such as Mealson-Wheels. This list is not all inclusive; but, it

should give clubs a good idea of when back ground checks need to be completed. Each one costs \$10 and our District Treasurer will bill the clubs as needed or monthly. The background check authorization form has been sent to club presidents and is also available on the District web site, after logging in, on the Administration page under Documents Download. Completed forms need to be sent to our District Risk Management Chair, Dr. Jeff Strickler.

The other members of your District RM Committee include Eric Clemmensen, Fritz Pierce, Sandi Filipowicz, Ray Murray, and Mitzi Vorachek.


