LITERACY PROJECT AWARD OFFERED

Rotary International has partnered on literacy projects with the International Reading Association (IRA) since 2002. These joint efforts are being recognized by the Pearson Foundation. For 2014, the foundation will make two awards of \$2500 each for projects undertaken between January 1, 2013 and June 15, 2014. Selected winners will be recognized at the IRA's International Literacy Day celebration in Washington, D.C., on September 8, 2014. came available on August 1, 2013 and they must be submitted by June 15, 2014. Winners will be notified on July 1, 2014.

The \$2500 award is not a grant. It is intended to celebrate sustainable literacy projects between Rotarians and IRA members.

of the project is slated for the end of April, 2014.

In order to make a down payment on the high temperature dishwasher and the commercial convection oven, \$3000 **must be raised by January 1st**. \$1760 is currently available or pledged. Club, business and individual financial support is being sought in raising a total of \$6000 needed to match and exceed the district DDF. The kitchen improvements will provide a safer food service for RYLA campers and for all who use the camp each year. Imagine you are the one feeding 120+ hungry teenagers and then doing the dishes required after three meals a day for 5 days along with daytime and evening snacks. That is a LOT of dishes and glasses.

The WHITEHALL CHALLENGE still stands—match their contribution of \$25.00 member to help improve our RYLA camp. Ω

and prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness."

Now, Therefore, I do recommend and assign Thursday, the 28th day of November next, to be devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the beneficent author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be; that we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks for His kind care and protection of the people of this country previous to their becoming a nation; for the signal and manifold mercies and the favorable interpositions of His providence in the course and conclusion of the late war; for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty which we have since enjoyed; for the peaceable and rational manner in which we have been enable to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national one now lately instituted for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed, and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and, in general, for all the great and various favors which He has been pleased to confer upon us.

<u>And, Also</u>, that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech Him to pardon our national and other transgressions; to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually; to render our National Government a blessing to all the people by constantly being a Government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed; to protect and guide all sovereigns and nations (especially such as have shown kindness to us), and to bless them with good governments, peace, and concord; to promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, and the increase of scarce among them and us; and, generally to grant unto all mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as He alone knows to be best." <u>George Washington, October, 1789</u>
