

#### NO IN-PERSON FUNDRAISER? TRY AN ON-LINE FUNDRAISER

With government instituted COVID restrictions affecting what was our normal operations, use of an online fund raising tool is a way for your club to generate those funds you need to carry on all the good Rotary work that you do. Your District Executive is providing the following information of two fund internet based on-line fund raising platforms without bias or endorsement.

The first platform is Eventgroove is located at <u>Eventgroove Fundraising</u>. This product is used by a number of Rotary Clubs, mostly in the USA but some in Canada.

The second platform is one provided through Rotary International is located at <u>Raise for Rotary</u>. This platform was used recently to raise funds for Polio Plus. The following is an extract from the FAQs related to this platform:

Rotary has introduced a new fundraising tool, initially in English and U.S. currency, that allows members to create fundraisers to share with their social networks. The following questions and answers will tell you more about how the platform works, so that you are familiar with it. For a preview, visit rotary.org/raise.

There are other fund raising tools available and they can be located by performing a query through a search engine on the Internet.

## **DAUPHIN ROTARY CLUB & PARTNERS BUILD BIKE TRAILS**

When Dauphin was chosen to host the Manitoba 2020 Summer Games the one facility the city was lacking was a mountain bike trail. Clayton Swanton, one of the local co-chairs for the games just happened to be a past club president with the Dauphin Rotary Club so he knew where his allies were to get the mountain bike track built. The club very quickly pledged \$50,000 to kick start the project and get a design plan in place.

The Dauphin Derailleurs Cycle club is the leadership team to seek funders, build alliances, and train volunteers. Howard Wirch (Dauphin Rotarian) is the group's current vice president. The system abuts Riding Mountain National Park and their staff have been consulted and involved from day one. The Northgate system connects to the park's existing trails and may spur yet more development. Land use

agreements with six different owners has made the project possible in this unique piece of the north escarpment. None of this would have been accomplished without the leadership and sweat equity of the trail dreamers and builders. Check out a feature video to see Clayton, Rotarian Kevin

Steinbachs (trail builder), and no fewer than four past club presidents and several other Rotarians hard at work on the trails. (Northgate Trails Dauphin on Facebook, October 11 post).

In response to the bold and transformational plan, our Rotary Club committed to an additional \$150,000 investment in what is now the Northgate Multi-Use Trails System. Other partners in the project include the City of Dauphin, RM of

Union, Community
Foundation, Western
Economic
Diversification fund,
and the Province of
Manitoba. The system
is made up of 26 kms
of trails that offer a
range of challenges for
amateur and
competitive mountain
bike enthusiasts, hikers,

bird watchers, and tourists of all ages. In COVID times, this magnificent facility is already a great boon to Dauphin residents. With overnight cabins, washrooms, shower facilities, and a picnic shelter, the trail head alone is a joy to experience. See you soon on the trails.
