ROTARIANS IN ACTION

Nearly 1.4 billion employed people live on less than \$1.25 a day. Our members promote economic and community development and reduce poverty in underserved communities through training, well-paying jobs, and access to financial management institutions. Projects

range from providing people with equipment to vocational training. Our members work to strengthen local entrepreneurs and community leaders, particularly women, in impoverished communities.

Rotarians are to be commended for supporting the Rotary Foundation Annual Fund which fund our District Global Grant and our International Global Grants.

From the Foundation Annual Fund, this past year District 5550 received \$61,304.76 to address local needs. Certified clubs were awarded 16 post secondary scholarship grants and 25 project grants which utilized all of the available funds.

Some project examples - a variety of COVID-19 projects ranging from support for Food Banks, school lunch programs, PPE for inner city schools to furnace replacement in Rotary senior living facility, assisting women in a Women's Shelter and summer literacy projects.

The Annual Fund is essential for Global projects as well. Currently there are 8 applications in draft or submitted stage and 11 approved applications underway in countries such as Guatemala, South Africa and India. Projects include literacy, water and sanitation and community economic development.

These projects cannot occur without the generous contributions by individual Rotary members. The challenge is to encourage all members to contribute even \$25.00 to the Annual Fund each year. By everyone making a contribution that fits into your budget it will assist in making a positive impact in our communities and Internationally.





Our own District Governor's Melfort Club's Sargeant-at-Arms collects a toonie from members every meeting to raise \$100.00 per member each year. This money is forwarded to the Foundation in December for the charitable tax receipt and maintain their EREY(Every Rotarian Every Year) status. What will you do?
