The <u>Ripple Effect Scholarship Fund</u> is administered by Rotary Club of Moose Jaw Wakamow. The Project Manager is Marian Kettlewell of the RC of Moose Jaw Wakamow. School opened in February, 2022 at the Santo Domingo Xenacoj Middle and High School. In April, the RC of Vista of Vista Hermosa hosted a Vocational day event for graduating students to talk about university courses and how to submit an application. The hope is 3-5 students will attend university next year.

The cost for a middle school scholarship is \$160 Canadian and high school is \$650 Canadian at current exchange rates. Total cost for 28 Middle School and 15 High school scholarships is \$11,000 US per year or \$14,500 Canadian. **Fundraising is ongoing for REP Scholarship recipients for the 2023 school year.** Rotary Clubs, Rotarian's and friends are encouraged to support this great program!

Teacher's Scholarship Project

The Ripple Effect Teachers Scholarship Program is administered by the RC of Winnipeg-Assiniboine. The coproject Managers are John Saunders and Warren Thompson.

Status: Status: Three of the four students are doing very well with averages ranging from 85% to 91%. The fourth student is struggling a bit with a 68% and failed one course. She can take the course again in 1st semester of 2023 at no cost to REP.

All four students are registered for the 2nd semester and the wire transfer for tuition will be sent to the University the week of September 19 to 23.

Total cost for 4 Teacher scholarships is \$4,500 US or \$6,000 Canadian.

Fundraising is ongoing for the Teacher Scholarship recipients for the 2023 School Year. Rotary Clubs, Rotarians and friends of Rotary are encouraged to support this program!

Covid-19 Level 3 - High - Update in Guatemala on September 17, 2022.

Majority of country is in red, orange and yellow zones. No green zones.

The number of confirmed cases now exceeds 1,114,758 the number of deaths is 19,648. Recovered: 1,092,521. A spike in the number of cases occurred in July and August and number of cases increased by over 218,000.

Vaccination Update: only 35% of the population is vaccinated.

Guatemala has one of the lowest vaccine rates in Latin America at 35% of a country with over 16.1 million. A lot of indigenous people are not getting vaccinated because they think it will damage their health, kill them or because of what the church told them. Missteps by government and health officials in connecting with the indigenous culture has led to low vaccination rates.

How school classes are delivered depends upon COVID and the "stoplight" which indicates the level of infection per municipality and regions. There are three models: virtual, "hybrid" or blended and actual attendance in the classrooms.

The Ripple Effect Program is changing lives and creating hope for a brighter future through education!!
