The Ripple Effect Scholarship Fund is administered by Rotary Club of Moose Jaw Wakamow. The Project Manager is Marian Kettlewell of the RC of Moose Jaw Wakamow. School will open in February 2023 at the Santo Domingo Xenacoj Middle and High School. New for 2023, RC of Vista Hermosa announced at our visit that in 2023 one of the graduating Scholarship students will be awarded a three - year scholarship to attend San Carlos University in Guatemala City. This Scholarship will be funded by the RC of Vista Hermosa.

The cost for a middle school scholarship is \$160 Canadian and high school is \$650 Canadian at current exchange rates. Total cost for 28 Middle School and 15 High school scholarships is \$11,000 US per year or \$14,500 Canadian. Fundraising is ongoing for REP Scholarship recipients for the 2023 school year. Rotary Clubs, Rotarian's and friends are encouraged to support this great program!

#### **Teacher's Scholarship Project**

The Ripple Effect Teachers Scholarship Program is administered by the RC of Winnipeg-Assiniboine. The coproject Managers are John Saunders and Warren Thompson.

Status: Gord and Deb were very happy to meet the four students in person for the first time. In November, a hybrid zoom meeting was held with the four students, Juan Carlos Villatoro (President of the University) and some of his staff, Gord and Deb and Warren joined the meeting via zoom. The students all made excellent power point presentation updating us on their activities during the school year. Most of the classes were in person with a few virtual classes. The school year ends at the end of November.

The students are completing the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of their studies and will be registering for 3<sup>rd</sup> year in January 2023. Next year, the plan is to have all in person classes.

Total cost for 4 Teacher scholarships is \$4,500 US or \$6,000 Canadian. Fundraising is ongoing for the Teacher Scholarship recipients for the 2023 School Year. Rotary Clubs, Rotarians and friends of Rotary are encouraged to support this program!
