# 100,000 US Match with the RC of Milwaukee! Only one school left to Fund

Escuela Oficila Rural Mixta Canton Panabaj is located in the community of Canton Panabaj,

Municipality of SANTIAGO ATITLÁN in the Department of SOLOLÁ

**Description of Project:** The project is the construction of four accessible new classrooms, new washrooms with one fully accessible toilet and wash stations and health and hygiene training.

Host Club: Rotary Club of Vista Hermosa. International Club: Rotary Club of St. Boniface/St. Vital

**Impact:** This would impact 277 students

Cost estimate is \$77,000 US. The municipality and community have committed to provide the skilled and unskilled labour and some materials for an approximate value of \$27,000 US.

Remaining to fundraise: \$10,000 US





### **Update on 2023/2024 Projects**

#### 1) San Isidro Robles School - RC of Kenora/ RC of Coatepeque and the Municipality

Construction of a perimeter wall around the school, new front gate and a new concrete pad for basketball and soccer. The Municipality funded and built the new concrete pad and front wall. **Estimated Cost: \$14,700 US**. Fully funded.

**Status**: The final financial report and supporting documents have been submitted and approved.

The Ripple Effect Scholarship Fund is administered by Rotary Club of Moose Jaw Wakamow. The Project Manager is Marian Kettlewell of the RC of Moose Jaw Wakamow.

**Status:** The RC of Vista Hermosa has provided a list of names and photos of the scholarship recipients for the 2024 school year. The students have now passed the half way point of the 2024 school year.

The cost for a middle school scholarship is \$160 Canadian and high school is \$650 Canadian at current exchange rates. Total cost for 28 Middle School and 15 High School scholarships is \$14,500 Canadian.

Fundraising is ongoing for REP Scholarship recipients for the 2025 school year.

Rotary Clubs, Interact Clubs, Rotarians and friends are encouraged to support this great program!

#### **Teacher's Scholarship Program**

The Ripple Effect Teachers Scholarship Program is administered by the RC of Winnipeg-Assiniboine. The coproject Managers are John Saunders and Warren Thompson.

**Status:** The four students have completed the 1<sup>st</sup> semester of the 2024 school year. The University staff is in the process of e-mailing the 1<sup>st</sup> semester marks and preparing an invoice for 2<sup>nd</sup> semester tuition.

Total cost for 4 Teacher Scholarships is \$4,500 US or approximately\$6,000 Canadian. **Fundraising is ongoing for the Teacher Scholarship recipients for the 2025 School Year.**Rotary Clubs, Rotarians and friends of Rotary are encouraged to support this program!
