1. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Please describe the project, its location, its objectives, and how they will be attained. Note: The project cannot be started until the district grants subcommittee approves the District Simplified Grant Application.

1. What is the purpose of this project? Provide a brief description.

Goal of the "Sunrise on Hunger" project is to donate 84,000 pounds of pasts to the Great Plains Food Bank which serves over 200 food pantries throughout North Dakota and Minnesota.

Our goal is to bring together the food chain in North Dakota & Minnesota. Farmers, General Public, Food Processors, and families who are in need. In the end, Sunrise on Hunger will raise enough money to donate 650,000 servings of pasta to the Great Plains Food Bank which services over 200 agencies throughout North Dakota and Western Minnesota that help feed the hungry.

How will it meet the needs of the community?

650,000 servings of pasta equates to 81,000 pounds of finished pasta. According to the Great Plains Food Bank, this amount will provide a three month supply of pasta to food kitchens, and food pantries in North Dakota and Minnesota. Our long term goal is to grow this into providing a 6 month – to a one year supply of pasta.

2. How will the host and partner(s) (District 5580 Rotary Club(s) and/or others) communicate and work together to implement this project? Please provide specific examples of activities.

This is a unique project in which one of, our partners, The KMOT Ag Expo, is a farming trade show owned solely by a local NBC Television Station. The TV station is going to use the power of Television to communicate the needs, Rotary's involvement, and follow the process from start to finish. Television promotional commercials will run on a regular schedule. KMOT-TV have done and will

continue to the cover the project, and report on it's progress. The final donation event will be a celebration, taking place when the KMOT Ag Expo cuts the ribbon on their 40th Anniversary Ag Show in January of 2011. We will have several dignitaries on hand to help hand over 81,000 pounds of pasta to the Great Plains Food Bank.

Members of Sunrise Rotary have taken this project on the road, talking to local civic organizations, local business, Churches, Minot State University presentations have been scheduled, along with a variety of Services Clubs in the Minot Community. Minot Sunrise Rotary introduced the project to our fellow Rotarians at the Winnipeg conference in May. We were able to sell our Rotary pasta pins, and raise close to \$300. More importantly, it helped Minot Sunrise Rotary spread the word on this project, and get our fellow Rotarians excited about a new way to help fill a need in their communities.

Partners have already been brought on board with pasta companies(Dakota Growers and Minot Milling) supplying the processed pasta and packing for free provided the Minot Sunrise Rotary Club can supply the 2000 bushels of durum wheat needed for the pasta processing. To date through on going fundraising we are nearly at 1/2 (\$4,500) of the\$10,000 goal to purchase the durum wheat. We also, have the support of the U.S Durum Growers association who has also began distributing information on the project to their hundreds of farm members.

Sunrise Rotary will make final celebration distribution in front of 40,000 attendees of the KMOT North Dakota Ag Expo by displaying pallets of pasta with Sunrise On Hunger banner including the Rotary International wheel and Minot Sunrise Rotary as the sponsor.

Club Members have and are making presentations to other service clubs in the area as well as individual groups and organizatons.

Along with a consistent promotional schedule running on KMOT-TV with the Sunrise On Hunger sponsored by Minot Sunrise Rotary, reaching 35,000+ households in Northwestern & North Central North Dakota.


