#### 1. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Please describe the project, its location, its objectives, and how they will be attained. Note: The project cannot be started until the district grants subcommittee approves the District Simplified Grant Application.

1. What is the purpose of this project? Provide a brief description.

FIELD of GREENS (FOG) is a vegetable garden/orchard/recreation area project of the Port Arthur Rotary Club, commenced in 2009, and to date has been an unequivocal success. PURPOSE: 1. Fresh produce and fruit grown under the stewardship of and for the homeless residents of the SALVATION ARMY Hostel in Thunder Bay, Ontario. FOG is situated right on the property of the Hostel, eliminating transportation, and ensuring major input by the residents themselves, in partnership with Rotarians

2. The Phase 1 infrastructure is in place, including (A) large soil plot, plantar boxes, portable "Earth Boxes" and apple/cherry/plum trees, (B) basketball "half-court", park like avenues between veggies for walking and donated benches, and area for bocce ball and future horse-shoe pit, and (C) covered recycled pagoda for residents use for sitting, socializing.

Phase 2 (this Project description) involves purchasing and erecting a pergola for the use of residents who wish to socialize and WHO ARE NON-SMOKERS. Around this will be further substrate for growing vines for veggies and possibly grapes. Residents will be asked to take charge of the latter, also monitor non-smoking. A storage trailer and pole in the vicinity detract from the ascetic of the FOG and removal to another area of the property will be a "final touch" to the original architected plan.

Phase 2 once completed, will assist in allowing transition of the functioning project directly to the Salvation Army.

Our Committee has obtained a preferred quote of \$4,324 for the 12x12ft pergola including tax. Foundation base will be extra.

#### 3. How will it meet the needs of the community?

The project to date has been successful with 2 harvests (first year actually better than second). There has been critical acclaim by many. Principally the residents have an entirely novel opportunity for fresh air, recreation, socialization and work (pride) in assisting with all the areas of planting, growing and tending, and harvesting the fresh produce.

The produce is harvested directly and used by the residents with input from the cook. Additional produce is offered to the hostel food bank clients (members of the community at large).

Physical activity on the court etc and fresh air is self-explanatory. The Club has partnered with the local University's Food Security Network, as well as other community vegetable garden projects for the needy. Even a research project undertaken with the (Lakehead) University has been completed to verify and quantify the value of on –site gardening.

Obviously, the FOG Phase 1 project has also energized the Port Arthur club as well.

One additional benefit to the community is interest generated by the general public who simply observe what is happening by driving by (the site is highly visible). The site is something of a paradigm for the emerging concept of vegetable gardening in the community.

The (half) court basketball area is available for local youth to use as well.

4. How will the host and partner(s) (District 5580 Rotary Club(s) and/or others) communicate and work together to implement this project? Please provide specific examples of activities.

The Host is the Salvation Army Hostel, Thunder Bay, partnering with the Port Arthur Rotary Club. The club approached the SA Major (a Rotarian) about converting the unused land adjacent to the hostel in 2009. The response was extremely positive and a strong partnership was born immediately and continues to the present. It is believed that a Rotary-Salvation Army partnership of this kind, for the sole benefit of the many clients of the SA, is unique in North America. Communication and teamwork is on a regular basis (example initial "planting day on May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012, brought out Rotarians, hostel residents and administrative staff, with several resident clients stepping up as stewards for the grounds).

Estimated project start date: Pending approval of application. Estimated project completion date: expected to be 2-4 months. It is hoped the project could proceed in the fall of 2012.


