with Fargo, West Fargo, and Moorhead School Districts since 2007. Today, TNT is part of the Fargo Special Education curriculum and serves over 21+ special education classes attending TNT on a weekly basis. With serving a large number of children with special needs, TNT is partnering with the Anne Carlsen Center (ACC) to start a childcare center, Learn n Move, to include children with special needs. The capacity is for 55 children with approximately 10% of the population to serve children with special needs. TNT Kid's Fitness has been instrumental in the creation and delivery of physical education elements in pre-school and childcare centers in the community. TNT has acquired equipment for mobile physical activity fitness labs and shares the equipment and provides training to area Head Start programs and daycares. TNT has supported the passing of a community health code that requires daycares to include physical activity as part of their structured curriculum and requires daycare providers to receive physical activity training provided by TNT.

The center will provide training models for the childcare industry professionals. TNT and ACC are Growing Futures approved organizations that are able to provide Continuing Education Units (CEU) to providers for annual licensure purposes. Currently TNT has trained over 500+ providers with physical activity curriculum to support the importance of movement as it relates to their cognitive, behavioral, and social needs.

As part of the Learn n Move childcare center, in the newly expanded facility, is the childcare outdoor space. This space will feature structures in the playground that children of all abilities will be able to play on. The playground equipment will align with TNT's mission of inclusivity to ensure children have the ability to play with their peers side by side coupled with the importance of physical activity.

- 1. Learning Wall: Accessible Panels perfect for use with mobility devices or wheelchairs. Combine multiple panels together to create an accessible learning wall for your early childhood playground.
- 2. Cozy Dome. A quiet space for over-stimulated kids, peek holes let kids and supervisors keep an eye on the action, various textures on the outer surface create a perfect climbing experience

Developmental Benefits for both pieces of equipment -

Sensory: Vestibular, Proprioception, Tactile; Motor Skills: Balance, Coordination, Core Body Strength Motor Planning, Upper Body Strength, Lower Body Strength, Flexibility Cognitive Skills: Problem Solving; Social/Emotional Skills Cooperation, Social Skill Development.

Careful consideration has been taken to ensure there are pieces of equipment that will be engaging, provide learning, activity, and inclusion.

The mission of The Rotary Foundation is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

How will this project meet the mission of Rotary Foundation?

TNT was founded on the basis that physical activity is necessary to ensure success in children, and that ALL children should have the same opportunity available to them. Physical Activity is a platform from which individuals of all abilities establish physical, cognitive, social, and emotional skills that allow them to thrive in multiple environments and for a life time.

How does this meet the mission? What makes Rotary different is their approach to solving community challenges. TNT spent several years working on taking down physical activity barriers by of connecting with parents of children with special needs who identified inclusive recreational opportunities were hard to find in our community and finding building space to accommodate any activity was even more difficult. In 2006, TNT was built to include programming for include every child. We recognized the challenges, hired adaptive PE staff to modify curriculum to include children of all abilities, partnered with over 25 organizations/agencies to offer space to collaborate and share their facility. What makes Rotary different is their responsible leadership means more than just doing good work—it means making the most out of every donation. This grant gift to support the outdoor play space is shared by multiple organizations all of which partner with TNT. TNT was built on collaboration; each gift not only supports TNT, but a host of other organizations in the

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community. This type of collaboration supports each organization sharing space and not duplicating programming or space.

SECTION 3: PROJECT PLANNING

TNT Kid's Fitness is a 501c3 organization and will maintain the structures at their current location. The Rotary district funds will be applied to the outdoor structures. The playground equipment will be supported and maintained by TNT. The executive director, Kim Pladson, will provide a report and onsite opportunities for local Rotarians to come visit and tour the space of the finished project.

Will training in use and maintenance of technical equipment (including software) be provided? If so, who will provide training? TNT conducts bi-annual equipment training and year-round safety training for all its employees. It is a requirement that all employees receive back ground checks, First Aid, CPR, AED trainings as well as the USA gymnastics basic training to be employed at TNT. TNT has invested in their own staff to become trainers in first aid, safety, physical activity certified. No technical equipment or software is needed for training.

Describe how the benefiting community will maintain this project after grant funding has been fully expended. The Learn n Move will be sustained through program fees paid by parents on a weekly basis. TNT has learned through several conversations with physical education teachers, therapists, and parents of children with special needs, that children had to engage in physical education in the hallways in school, as they were not able to accommodate these needs in the typical class nor was there gym space available. It is equally challenging to find childcare with inclusive opportunities as well as peer play with day-to-day interactions.

The childcare space will provide a much needed inclusive opportunities for parents. It is difficult to find childcare to include their child with special needs. These playground structures will be a benefit by promoting equality, inclusion, and social interaction to enhance the holistic approach of child development.

Describe specific activities of the benefiting community partners in implementing the project.

TNT is proud to partner with Rotary to lift up their community service commitment and mission in the community. TNT hosts several events annually that involve children of all abilities that support a volunteer component.

- 1. Rotarians can volunteer to read to children at the childcare during special themed weeks i.e. Dr. Seuss week.
- 2. Assist in the Chamber Ribbon Cutting bringing light to the service club's mission and the investment made for the playground.
- 3. Identify the equipment the grant supported with a recognition plate on the playground pieces supported by the grant.

How will the Rotarians who are members of the partner clubs be involved the project? Please note that financial support is not considered active involvement. (See the District Grant application instructions for suggestions.)

Special events throughout the year are facilitated at TNT. TNT has a volunteer component to its organization to help run events and partner with other agencies, service clubs, and organizations. TNT supports community events and participates in i.e.: facilitate the fitness for the Fargo Youth Marathon Run and Energize Nights at local neighborhood schools to name a few. TNT believes and invests in community initiatives that focus on health for our youth.

TNT would encourage an onsite service club weekly meeting to be hosted at TNT. The volunteer component at TNT is endless when it comes to serving or providing an opportunity that Rotarians are able to participate in.

Indicate what financial arrangements have been made to pay for this project (i.e. Are you working with other organizations or are Rotarian contributions a part of your funding)?

The project date is set to start after July 1, 2016. An initial 50% down payment is required to order the equipment and have an install date confirmed for the July timeframe.

The outdoor playground structure is being supported in part by the AM & PM Rotary clubs as a partnership support. Other sources of donations are being solicited for the remaining structures of the playground. Total Playground fitted up is \$85,635.
