



PEACE NOTES - RECOGNIZING HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Human trafficking, modern day SLAVERY, is happening all around us. Here are some tips to help you recognize it.

ADULT Red Flags:

- Lack of knowledge of their whereabouts
- Restricted or controlled conversation
- Individual lives with their employer or on the job site
- Not in control of own ID/passport
- Branding/tattooing of name or image denoting ownership
- Not dressed for the season or place
- Shows signs of physical/sexual abuse
- Shows signs of malnourishment
- Appears unusually fearful or anxious
- Accompanied by a controlling adult

What to Report....

- Say "This looks like a human trafficking situation."
- Description of vehicle
- Descriptions of people
- Specific times and dates of suspicious activity
- Address and locations of suspicious activity
- ONLY if you are SAFE, take a picture

Call 1-888-3737-888 to report suspicious situation that could be human trafficking. Call 911 if you witness a crime.






