# A bold, audacious goal!

# Background

- International "Business"
  - \$150 Billion annually, over 28 million victims female and male
- Human Trafficking (HT) reported in all 50 US states
- In KS Labor and Sex trafficking reported in urban, rural and suburban areas "Originating State" - hub for victimization and transportation
- HT occurs when something of value is traded for sex with vulnerable adult or child
- Exploits person's vulnerabilities Victims stay due to manipulation, threats, fraud

# Background

- All commercial sex is NOT always trafficking, BUT • under 18 - ALWAYS is
  - 18 and over IF it is a result of force, fraud, coercion
- Traffickers are not always strangers: include romantic partners, parents, other family members, groomers, pimps, etc.
- Love Trap: Build her up; Control her life; Start putting her down; Everything her fault; Now she is completely dependent
- HT is not human smuggling



### Victims/survivors Represent Every Race, Ethnicity, Sex, and Gender

### •Youths

- Average age is 13
- Most at-risk: Foster kids, runaways, those who experienced abuse, neglect, and other forms of trauma

- Can be straight A students from stable, good homes Children with special needs - don't understand being trafficked Children who are having sex anyway
- Pregnant teens
- Kids that are bullied
- Kids that didn't get asked to be on the team any team!
- People who need money
- Those without legal immigration status

## Why They Stay

- Shame e.g., revealing nude pictures to family Threatened with violence to their children or someone else that love They have no access to money; no home to go to

- They are forced to do crime:
  - shoplifting, drugs, recruitment of others, bad credit
- Their groomer got them pregnant
- Convinced their groomer loves them (Love Trap) can take up to 6 rescues to leave
- Low self-esteem
- Symptoms are similar for domestic violence

### **Crux of the Issue - Addressing Demand**

- 20% of men pay for sex
- 70% white; 50% married
- 2% of buyers account for 75% of transactions
- Buyers (aka Johns) can be anyone, including
  - professionals
  - students
  - tourists
  - military personnel
  - family member

### How Do We Address It? Need For

- Creating greater understanding how demand is driven:
  - porn normalization of sexual objectification and violence; self-gratification at expense of others
  - pimp culture "successful" businessperson in the "hood"
  - sexually oriented businesses massage parlors, escort services, hourly hotels
- Expanding education programs for first-time offenders on realities of HT
  - Stopping Sexual Exploitation (SSE) non-traditional "John" school
  - 2 initial interviews; 8 weekly sessions
  - 64% report wanting to stop buying
  - 90% of those completing the program have different view of prostitution
- Engaging all of community awareness to decrease demand

### **Reforms Needed in Kansas -**

- **Education of all lawmakers on HT and its impact**
- Help to build on past progress target areas still in need
- Focus on reforms for both sex and labor trafficking \*
- \* Labor Trafficking
  - used in supply chains on imported goods
  - KS

Help new legislators and policy makers understand history of anti-HT efforts

### How Can We Support Survivors?

- Accurate reporting using appropriate terminology
  - Prostitute vs. Victim
- Victims are not criminals (KS one of first states to make distinction) Respecting victims' rights to tell their own story Encouraging and supporting survivors and those working to help them
- Increasing resources and solutions for
  - affordable housing
  - meaningful employment
  - every day needs food, transportation, healthcare
  - mentoring justice involved youth
- Providing trauma training for community leaders and organizations
- Sponsoring meaningful activities for youth
- Creating a safe place for victims which provide needed services in one location

### What Local Rotarians Are Doing

- Anti-HT Awareness and Action Conference open to public
- Hosted a virtual Social Justice Party
- Topeka Day Center Topeka, India partner
  - Day Center for Victims of Human Trafficking
  - nap space, lockers, counseling
- Community Action Against Human Trafficking eCause Club (CAAHT)

HT awareness sessions for SMSD - teachers, social workers, administration

• YWCA NE KS Center for Safety and Empowerment - provide showers, laundry,

### What Are Rotarians Doing?

- 2021-22 Global SWARM initiative Leawood & Lenexa as pilot/Taiwan partner collaborated with local service providers, law enforcement, corrections, other community leaders and Rotarians to educate and develop on
- techniques to counter HT systems
- 2022-23 District grant for 114 Rotary Cares Kits (clothing and hygiene items in duffle bags) - Rotary Clubs of CAAHT eClub, Lawrence, Leawood, Lenexa, Manhattan, Topeka South
- 2023-24 District Grant Winter Rotary Cares Kits winter clothing, blankets, lip balm, protein snacks in duffle bags - Rotary Clubs of CAAHT eClub, Leawood, Lenexa, Manhattan, Overland Park South, Shawnee Mission



### What Can You Do?

  - Know what your kids and grandkids are doing on the internet
    - Predators "troll" social media: Instagram, TikTok, Facebook, etc.
  - Blue Campaign brochure "How to Talk to Youth about Human Trafficking"
