



Rotary District 5710 2022-2023 District Grants

In the 2022-23 Rotary year, under the District Grants Policy guidelines, the District awarded \$72,800 to district and club projects. This included Allocated and Discretionary Funds. Below are club/district projects funded with this year's Rotary Foundation SHARE allocation.

Ambassadors	Global Grant	3,050
Burlington	Provide and distribute dictionaries to fourth grade students. Members will distribute the dictionaries.	99
Community Action Against Human Trafficking	Purchase and assemble personal care kits to be given to victims of human trafficking.	661
Community Action Against Human Trafficking	The project involves screening films and documentaries about global forced organ harvesting to local Rotary Clubs and universities, which will raise public awareness of this serious human rights issue.	600
Emporia	Program provides baby and toddler essentials to families in the community.	1,780
Gardner	Provide and distribute dictionaries, bookmarks and rulers to elementary students.	1,512
Kansas City	Provide two \$1500 scholarships to one male and one female graduating senior among the nine area high schools. Rotarians select the winner based on their presentation at a club meeting.	1,594
Kansas City	Provide and distribute books to students in a summer reading program.	840
Lawrence	This is a project taken on by several clubs in the district. It provides a new pair of shoes to underprivileged children who have "earned" them by volunteer hours. Rotarians accompany each children during their shopping experience.	3,800
Jayhawk Breakfast Lawrence	Provide scholarships to local high school students. Scholarships are awarded based on essays presented on "Service Above Self".	3,473
Leavenworth	Provide 3 academic (\$2000) and 2 vocational/technical (\$1000) scholarships to area high school students. Rotarians select the winners, and present awards at a weekly luncheon.	3,526
Leawood	A mentoring and scholarship program for underprivileged juniors and seniors at a local high school. Funds are used for educational materials and scholarships through 4 years of college. Rotarians provide over 500 hours of service a year.	3,793
Lenexa	The club will support a community project helping veterans. Club will provide gift cards for food, fuel and shoes and will also assist in a food drive.	2,287
Lenexa	Project will purchase and assembly 'care kits' to help survivors of human trafficking. Kits contain basic clothing, hygiene and personal items.	5,000
Manhattan	The club honors one high school senior a month, inviting them to a club meeting. These students then compete for two \$1000 college scholarships.	1,333
Manhattan	The club will help upgrade the facilities of a local shelter helping the victims of sex trafficking.	1,613
Manhattan	This project includes the local club and the support of the Rotaract and Interact clubs. The project will maintain trees planted in a previous project in local parks and public areas.	1,620
Manhattan Konza	Projects supports a community center for those with special needs. The club will help upgrade the facilities grounds and add a garden.	1,000
Manhattan Konza	Project will assist a local organization serving abused and neglected children by helping to paint their facility.	1,431
Manhattan Konza	The club will help upgrade the landscaping of a local shelter helping the victims of sex trafficking.	833
Olathe	The club will provide and maintain health and wellness care kits to the schools in the local district.	2,146
Olathe-Santa Fe Trail	Providing three \$1,000 scholarships to local high school students. Members select the best applicants for the awards.	1,213

Olathe-Santa Fe Trail	The club will purchase health items to be used in the assembly of disaster recovery kits. The kits will be distributed by a local agency that coordinates national and international disaster response.	1,500
Overbrook	The club will partner with the local school district to provide reading materials and science/architectural building kits for classroom instruction. Members will assist in instruction.	1,106
Overland Park	Club will provide scholarships to local high school seniors who are members of the Interact Club or National Honor Society, focusing on community service.	1,690
Overland Park South	Provide a holiday gift shopping experience for underprivileged kids. Rotarians accompany the children shopping for themselves and/or others. Then help wrap presents and attend a pizza party to celebrate the holidays.	2,252
Paola	Club is contributing to a local back to school fair. Specifically they will provide new shoes or clothes to underprivileged students.	1,264
Shawnee	Provide and distribute bicycle safety helmets at a local event.	3,473
Topeka	This project provides coats to underprivileged children. Rotarians will provide a 'shopping experience' with the children in selecting a coat.	2,993
Topeka	This project provides basic apparel and school supplies to underprivileged children. Rotarians will purchase needed items and help in the distribution.	3,500
Topeka South	With a local elementary school, the program provides a book and lunch to students monthly to recognize outstanding achievements.	694
Topeka South	This is a project taken on by several clubs in the district. It provides a new pair of shoes to underprivileged children who have "earned" them by volunteer hours. Rotarians accompany each child during their shopping experience.	2,372
Topeka South	Through the local Interact Club, provide lunches for students unable to afford it.	2,000
Valley Heights, Blue Rapids	The club will help construct a play area and provide a new bench in the local park.	201
