WHERE AND WHEN:

RYLA will be hosted at the University of Kansas, Lawrence campus June 2-6, 2024. Students will stay overnight in Ellsworth Hall.

Considered one of the most beautiful in the nation, KU's main campus occupies 1,000 acres on and around historic Mount Oread in Lawrence, a community of more than 80,000 in the forested hills of eastern Kansas. Campus includes a wide range of education and recreational facilities to meet the needs of a diverse student body including:

- The Robert Dole Institute of Politics
- The Natural History Museum
- The Lied Center of Kansas, KU's performing arts venue
- The Kansas Union, housing and KU Bookstore and KU Dining Facilities

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

HOW DO I APPLY?

1. Fill out the RYLA 2024 application found at www.Rotary5710.org
2. Reach out to a local Rotary club, you can find them at my.rotary.org/en/club-search

Check with your local club for the deadline to apply, but generally in April!

WHO PAYS FOR THE CAMP?

Your local Rotary Club pays for the \$400 camp fee and ask for a \$25 agreement fee from campers.

CAN I LEAVE CAMPUS?

No, because of the nature of our camp, we require all attendees to stay for the duration of the camp. Please let other commitments know you will not be able to make it. RYLA is an overnight camp where campers are required to stay the whole time.

WHAT'S THE SLEEPING ARRANGEMENT?

Each participant will be staying in a double occupancy room in a residence hall on campus. You'll meet your roommate at the time of move-in. Each floor shares a communal restroom and showering facility. Rooms come with a twin bed and mattress; however, participants will need to bring their own bedding/linens or sleeping bag and pillow. Our KU facilitators will supervise each floor.

WHAT CLOTHES SHOULD I BRING?

Since you'll be spending time both in and outside, bring comfortable and camp appropriate clothes and shoes. You'll need athletic shoes and clothes that you won't mind wearing outside and possibly getting dirty. Also bring a sweatshirt as the residence hall can be cold with the air conditioning, and one business casual outfit for the graduation program.
