Fresh ideas for service - Walk away with new project inspiration and proven strategies to bring back home.

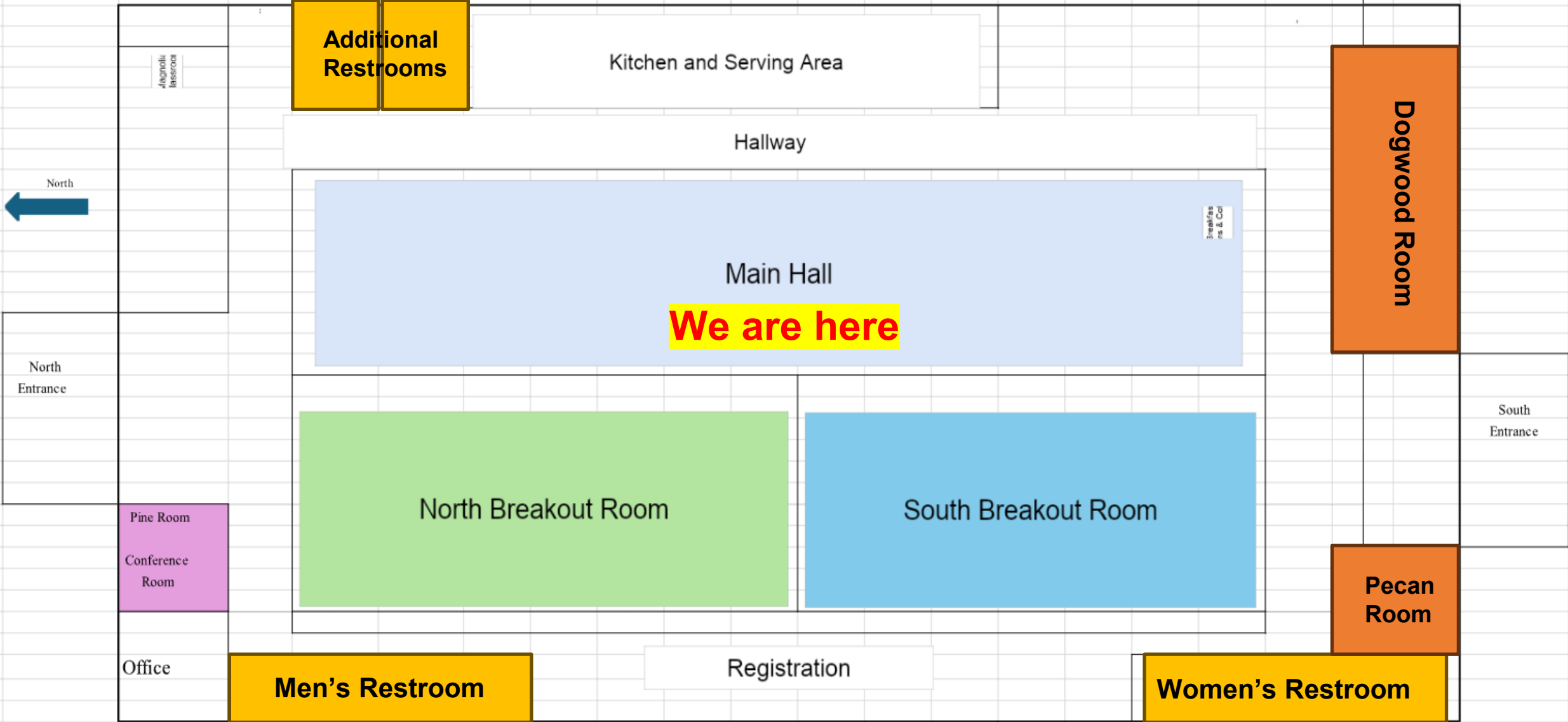
Prepare for leadership roles - Whether you're stepping into a new position or considering one, this assembly gives you the tools and confidence you need.

Stay aligned with Rotary goals - Learn about district priorities and how your club fits into the bigger picture.

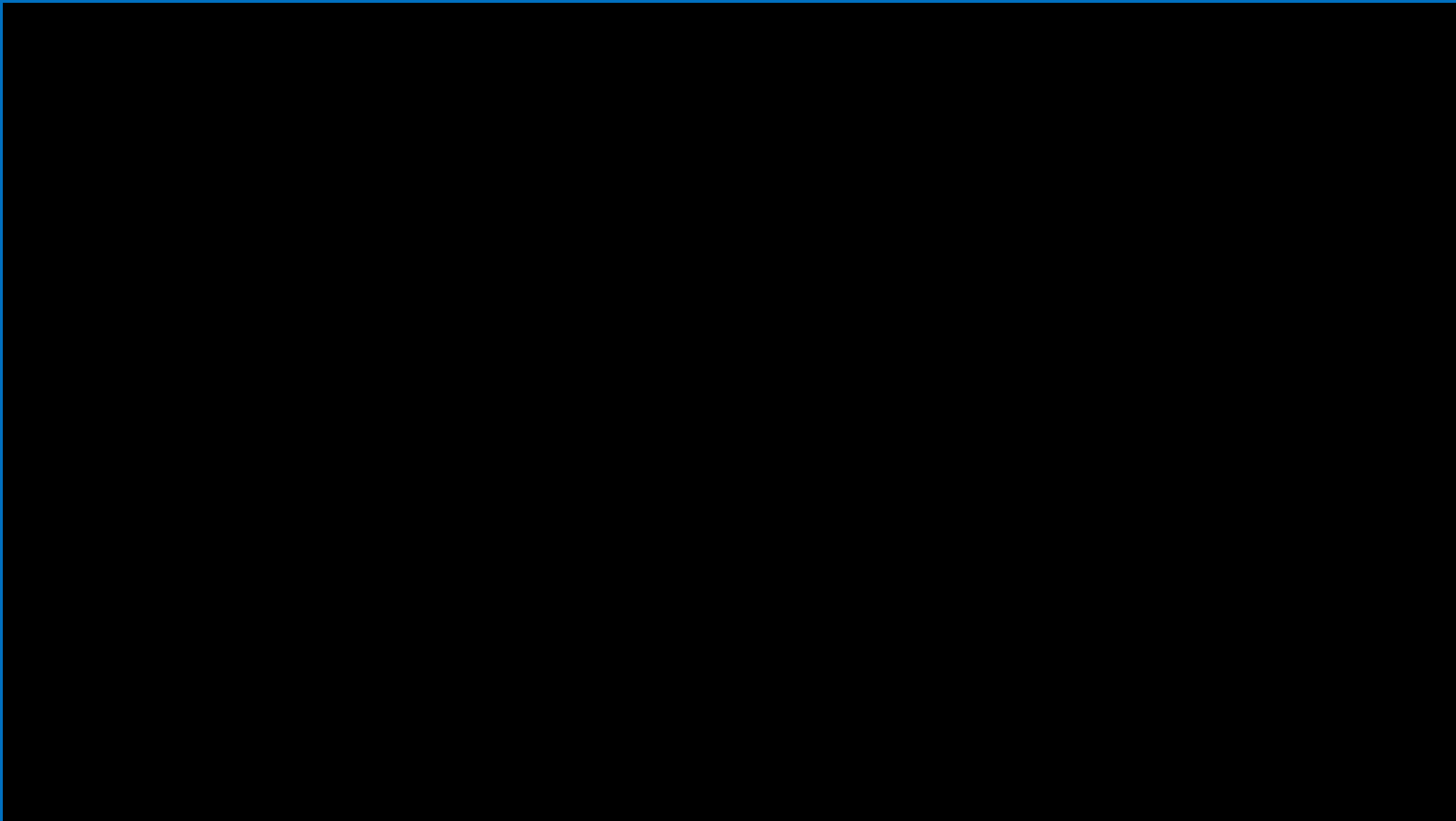
Boost your motivation - There's something energizing about being surrounded by people who care about service as much as you do.
