

EMPOWERING GIRLS: Background, Talking Points & Project Ideas

Equality is a fundamental human right that's necessary for a peaceful, prosperous, and sustainable world. Still, girls and women worldwide face inequities in areas including health and education, and they experience violence and poverty at higher rates than men.

Continuing to promote Empowering Girls throughout the Rotary world is important to improving the health, education, well-being, and economic security of girls across the globe.

Empowering girls means supporting them to ensure that their basic needs are met while working to transform the structures and institutions that reinforce and perpetuate gender discrimination and inequality. It includes helping girls develop self-confidence and make their voices heard.

According to the United Nations, empowering girls includes five components:

- Their sense of self-worth
- Their right to have and to determine choices
- Their right to have access to opportunities and resources
- Their right to have power to control their own lives, both within and outside the home
- Their ability to influence the direction of social change to create a more just social and economic order, nationally and internationally

TALKING POINTS:

- We encourage clubs and districts to engage in one or more activities that address the inequities affecting girls.
- A club or district might identify inequities that girls face in one region or culture that are different from the inequities they face in other regions and cultures. Clubs and districts should aim to address inequities in the regions and cultures where their projects and activities will be implemented.
- Empowering girls aligns with Rotary's areas of focus and the goals of our Action Plan. We can increase our impact through projects that protect, empower, and create equity for girls. These projects could focus on:
 - o Supporting access to health care and nutrition
 - o Ensuring access to water, sanitation, and hygiene resources
 - o Preventing exploitation, neglect, and physical and emotional violence
 - Supplying menstrual health and hygiene resources
 - o Providing access to basic education, skills training, and technology
 - o Preventing or raising awareness about child labor and child marriage
 - Offering opportunities for girls to elevate their voices and articulate their views, ideas, and opinions

- The success of a project is determined by systemic, cultural, and behavioral changes that result in greater gender equality and better lives for girls.
- Rotary International strives to create and maintain a safe environment for all youth who participate in
 Rotary activities. To the best of their ability, Rotary members, their partners, and other volunteers must
 safeguard the children and young people with whom they come into contact and protect them from

EMPOWERING GIRLS PROJECT IDEAS:

Some general ideas for Empowering Girls projects which clubs can adopt and adapt include:

- A <u>WASH</u> in schools project that provides girls with access to education by providing gender-segregated toilet facilities, improving sanitation in schools and enabling girls to attend regularly. (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene).
- Enrollment and retention of girls in schools (Basic Education and Literacy).
- Scholarships for girls to continue education (Basic Education and Literacy).
- Distribution of items, i.e., Bicycles, solar lights, etc. that help motivate the girls to continue education (Basic Education and Literacy).
- Teaching self-defense techniques to girls (Basic Education and Literacy).
- Skills development project for girls (<u>Economic Development</u>).
- A project that provides girls with reusable sanitary napkins and hygiene education also allows girls to stay in school, provides health education and creates a sustainable solution to disposable menstrual hygiene products. (Disease Prevention, Environment, Economic Development).
- A project that supports a safe house or recovery program for girls who are victims of human trafficking, by providing supplies, repairs, equipment, funding for counseling or other needs, to enable abused girls to reenter a normal, nonviolent life. (Peace, Economic Development).
- Counseling for victims of violence and discrimination (Peace).
