
IMPORTANT FOR ALL DISTRICT 5890 CLUBS:

Is Your Club Shown On The "Map of Clubs in District 5890"? Does Your Club's "Contact Page" Link to Your Website? Note: As the D5890 webmasters, we don't have access to make this correction for you...ClubRunner ONLY ALLOWS CLUBS to edit their club's information.

Problem #1: Is Your "Club Website Icon" missing? (if it's not there, visitors can't visit your website)*

Here's how to check: Go to <u>www.RotaryD5890.org</u>, and in the column on the right, scroll to "District Information" (see example above, right). Click "<u>Club Directory & Contacts</u>", then click your club's name. When your club's info page opens, is there a "*Club Website*" icon (*see example on the right*) just below the map? If there is, click the icon to make sure the link works. If there isn't an icon, visitors can't find you, so see the "SOLUTION"* section below. **Problem #2:** Does your club appear on the "Map of Clubs in District" webpage?*

Click "Map of Clubs in District" on the homepage. Look on the map - Is your club there - If so, is all the info correct? When you click your map locator pin, does the pop-up screen show meeting address & time, president's name, email address, & phone? *SOLUTION FOR PROBLEM #1 AND #2 - It's a 10-minute fix that can only be done by your club webmaster or club executive going to your club's website, login, and on the Administration Page, click "Club Info & Settings" in the second row of the Navigation Bar. Here's the link to ClubRunner's "how-to" instructions which you need to print before you start: "How Do I View and Edit Club Information". Note: For the missing website icon, you'll need to copy the URL of your club's web address and paste it in the "Website" section. The Club Info & Settings page is where you update your club's official logo (do not use this year's "The Magic of Rotary" logo) update the club's contact person, meeting location, contact phone and email address, etc. Need help? Do ALL Your Members Have a "My Rotary" Account on Rotary.org?



ALL D5890 Rotarians need to have a My Rotary Account on <u>www.Rotary.org</u>? <u>Click here</u> for instructions to create your account. It gives you access to the areas of the website the general public can't access or view.

<u>ClubRunner Login versus Rotary.org Login</u>: Your "My Rotary" Account on <u>www.Rotary.org</u> is a completely different account than your ClubRunner account (like Amazon vs. Walmart). 2024-25 Club Excellence Award for Rotary, Rotaract, & Interact Clubs(formerly the Rotary Citation)




This is the most prestigious award that a club can receive! The "Club Excellence Award" comes directly from the President of Rotary International is the new name for the Rotary Citation effective 1 July 2024. The award recognizes Rotary, Rotaract, and Interact clubs that successfully achieve goals that are aligned with Rotary's action plan.

Established in 1992, the award has undergone some changes over the years to remain relevant and to continue to align with Rotary's strategic objectives. The Rotary International Board of Directors approved the name change to better convey its intent as recognition of club excellence.
