WORLD POLIO DAY IS 24 OCTOBER



One Day, One Focus, Ending Polio.

World Polio Day is a time for Rotarians, public health advocates and all who want a world free from polio to come together, recognize our progress in the fight to end polio, and talk about the actions we need to take in order to end polio for good.

Since 1988, Rotarians have worked to reduce the number of worldwide polio cases by 99.9 percent; only two countries remain endemic. But until we end polio forever, every child is at risk of contracting the disease, for which there is no cure. Unless we eradicate polio, within 10 years, as many as 200,000 new cases could occur around the world each year.

Rotarians are encouraged to visit endpolio.org, where they can register their World Polio Day Action – you can choose to donate your time, your voice or your funds to the fight to eradicate polio. Remember: every dollar Rotary commits to end polio will be tripled thanks to a matching agreement with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, up to \$50 million each year.

As of October 13, 1,236 Rotary Clubs worldwide had registered to undertake one of these three actions. Please join them and we can fight polio together.


Angelina Rotary Club sponsors 'Pop Pauly for Polio Eradication' on Nov. 1



Port Arthur Rotarian honored by The Martin Luther King Jr. Support Group of Southeast Texas



Dr. Rosalind Queen, President-Elect of the Rotary Club of Port Arthur, has been selected as a 2026 MLK, Jr. Honoree by The Martin Luther King, Jr. Support Group of Southeast Texas. Honorees are chosen who exemplify Dr. King's principles of equality, justice and community service.

The organization was established in 1986 when founder Hargie Faye Savoy sat down with Coretta Scott King in her Port Arthur home and was asked to launch a group inspired by Martin Luther King, Jr.'s leadership and commitment to nonviolent resistance and racial equality. Focusing on civil rights activism in the Southeast Texas region, the organization hosts annual events, including an annual brunch and awards presentation hosted on Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday. Dr. Queen will be recognized at the Jan. 19, 2026 MLK, Jr. Brunch event.

Dr. Queen is a Commissioner for the City of Port Arthur's Planning and Zoning Commission. A US Army veteran who served in Desert Storm, Dr. Queen is also Vice President of the Port Arthur linking Military Sisters (PALMS) group, and a member of the Common Defense Situation Report (SITRIP).

Dr. Queen, who will serve as the Port Arthur Club's President for 2026-27, is also the Club's Past Secretary. She currently serves as a Trustee and Secretary of the Club's Foundation Board.
