




SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES

Suzi Howe dedicated her career to education after graduating from the University of Kansas. She owned and operated South Shore Montessori, a private school, until her retirement in 2019. It was during the construction of that school that she first learned about Rotary, as her broker, architect, and others involved were all Rotarians. Within six months of joining Rotary in 1992, she was already serving on her club's board.

Passionate about sharing her training and educational skills, she has volunteered as training leader and as a member of the Rotary Leadership Training and Development Committee. She has also served RI as regional Rotary Foundation coordinator, host committee advisor for the 2022 Rotary International Convention, and vice chair of the End Polio Now Countdown to History Challenge Committee. In 2005, Howe won the Dome City Award on behalf of all Houston-area Rotarians for her work running logistics for the 650 Rotarian volunteers at the Houston Astrodome who helped 250,000 Hurricane Katrina evacuees from New Orleans over a three-week period.

Howe is also a talented fundraiser, having organized three separate Million Dollar Dinners, the last one alone raising \$3.8 million for The Rotary Foundation. "If you make eye contact with me, I will be asking you to make a contribution," she says. Howe is a recipient of the Service Above Self Award, and The Rotary Foundation's Distinguished Service Award and Citation for Meritorious Service. She and her husband, Bill, are Arch Klumph Society and Bequest Society members.

District 5910 conducts a Long Term (school year) Youth Exchange Program and a Short Term Youth Exchange Program for high School age students. All programs are open to all young people of both genders including children and grandchildren of Rotarians. Participants serve as ambassadors of goodwill promoting better understanding among people of different cultures. Costs are paid by participants.

Long Term Program – For high school students of age 15 to $18\frac{1}{2}$ – Length of stay: a school year. Participants live as a member of at least two (usually three) different host families in another country and attend school there. In particular, students go from District 5910 to districts in other countries and students from districts in other countries come to District 5910. In addition to learning a new culture and a new language, participants develop a greater maturity and a deeper understanding of themselves and the world.

Short Term Program – For high school students of age 15 to $18\frac{1}{2}$ – Length of stay: about 3 wks. Usually, matched students of the same gender exchange visits in succession during the same summer break from school, but other arrangements are possible. Living in matched student homes, participants gain a better understanding of a new and different way of life.

The District Youth Exchange Chairman serves as District Youth Exchange Officer arranging exchanges with Rotary districts in other countries of the world, and as leader of the District Youth Exchange Committee. The Chairman also serves as a member of the Board of Directors of South Central Rotary Youth Exchange, Inc., the organization which issues documents for visas for our inbound students and trains Rotary volunteers working in this program. The Chairman is responsible for program compliance with Rotary International and other regulatory agencies.







BYLAWS OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL DISTRICT 5910

Adopted by members attending the business meeting of the District Conference in 1990. Amended by members attending the business meeting of the District Conference on May 1, 2011. Amended by members attending the business meeting of the District Conference on May 3, 2015.

ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this organization shall be Rotary International District 5910.

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

The purposes of this organization are: (i) To encourage, promote, extend, and assist Rotary and Rotary clubs in District 5910, and (ii) To coordinate and generally direct the activities of Rotary International in District 5910.

ARTICLE III. OBJECT

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

First. The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

Second. High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

Third. The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life:

Fourth. The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP

The membership of Rotary International District 5910 shall consist of all Rotary Clubs located in the geographical area designated by Rotary International as District 5910 which continue to perform the obligations as set forth in the Constitution and the Bylaws of Rotary International.

Boundary Description approved for District 5910 by Rotary International on July 1, 1968: USA - Texas, that portion south of the northern boundaries of the counties of Shelby, Nacogdoches and Anderson and south of latitude 31degrees 47 " in Cherokee County. East of the western boundaries of the counties of Anderson, Houston, Madison, Brazos, and Grimes. North of the southern boundaries of Brazos, Grimes and Montgomery, and east of the western boundaries of the counties of Liberty, Chambers, and Galveston.

ARTICLE V. COMPLIANCE WITH CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

Rotary International District 5910 shall be bound by and comply with the Constitution and Bylaws of Rotary International.

ARTICLE VI. OFFICERS

<u>Section 1.</u> District Governor. The chief administrative officer of the district shall be the District Governor. The District Governor is an officer of Rotary International. His/Her duties and responsibilities are as designated in the Constitution and Bylaws of Rotary International.

<u>Section 2.</u> District Vice Governor. The nominating committee for governor will select one Past District Governor to serve as a District Vice Governor. The role of the District Vice Governor is to replace the District Governor in case of temporary or permanent inability to serve. It is a best practice for Districts to use the regular governor election process to select the District Vice Governor.

<u>Section 3.</u> District Governor-Elect. The District Governor-Elect shall assist the District Governor as requested and fulfill all duties and responsibilities as are designated in the Constitution and Bylaws of Rotary International.

Section 4. Assistant Governors. As provided in the Rotary International "District Leadership Plan", as many Assistant Governors as deemed needed by the District Governor shall be appointed by the District Governor to serve a term of one (1) year to coincide with the term of the District Governor. They may continue in that capacity if asked by the next incoming District Governor but may serve no more than three (3) one (1) year terms. They must have been an active member of a club in the District for at least three (3) years, have served as president of a club for a full term and have demonstrated outstanding performance at the district level. They must agree to attend the Assistant Governor training session, the District Conference and District Assembly, visit each club in his/her assigned area a minimum of once each quarter, attend the Club Assembly, help each club plan for the Governor's club visit, encourage clubs to follow through on requests and recommendations of the Governor and keep the Governor informed on problems and progress within their assigned clubs.

Section 5. The District Treasurer. The District Treasurer shall be appointed by the District Governor to serve a term of one (1) year to coincide with the term of the District Governor. The District Treasurer shall oversee the collection of all funds and payment of all district obligations under the direction of the District Governor and the District Finance Committee. He/she shall also serve as a non-voting member of the District Finance Committee and carry out additional duties set out in the District Bylaws. The District Treasurer shall be an active member of a club in the district and be a Certified Public Accountant licensed to practice in the State of Texas. The District Treasurer shall present to the Audit Committee of the District all billing and disbursement information for the year.

<u>Section 6.</u> District Secretary. The District Secretary shall be appointed by the District Governor to serve a term of one (1) year to coincide with the term of the District Governor. The District Secretary shall assist the District Governor as requested and shall carry out any duties set out in the District Bylaws for this office. The District Secretary shall be an active member of a club in the district.

Section 7. Representative to Council on Legislation. As stated in Article 8 (8.020) of the Bylaws of RI, each representative must be a member of a club in the district and must have served a full term as an officer of RI at the time of election. If no past officer is available, the present Governor or Governor-Elect may be elected with the certification of the Governor and with the concurrence of the President of RI. Voting shall be as outlined in Article 8 (8.050) of the Bylaws of RI, and the representative shall be elected at the Annual District Conference of the district two (2) years preceding the Council. Any club may nominate a qualified member of their club who has indicated a willingness to serve. The club shall certify the nomination in writing. The duties of the representatives are as indicated in Article 8 (8.030) of the Bylaws of RI. No Rotarian shall attend more than three meetings of the council as a representative.

<u>Section 8.</u> Immediate Past District Governor. The immediate Past District Governor shall serve as an officer of the district. He/she shall assist the District Governor as requested and carry out any duties set out in the District Bylaws.

<u>Section 9.</u> Contract Assistance. The District Governor, with the concurrence of the Finance Committee, may contract for services as needed to further the goals of the district.

ARTICLE VII. FINANCES

<u>Section 1.</u> The District Operating Fund. There shall be established in the district a fund to be called "The District Operating Fund" for the financing of district-sponsored projects and the administration and development of Rotary in the district as provided in Article 15 (15.060.1) of the Bylaws of Rotary International. The financing of The District Operating Fund shall be provided by all the clubs in the district by way of a per capita levy on the members of the clubs.

Section 2. The District Reserve Fund. There shall be established in the district a fund to be called "The District Reserve Fund" for use in unusual or emergency conditions to fund shortages in the Operating Fund. The Reserve Fund shall be maintained at a level of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00). The transfer of Reserve Funds to Operating Funds may be authorized by a majority vote of the Finance Committee. In the event funds are used from the Reserve Fund, the annual dues paid by the clubs to the district shall be increased by a special one-time levy the following year in an amount sufficient to return the Reserve Fund balance to Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00). Interest earned on the Reserve Fund shall be transferred to the Operating Fund.

Section 3. Dedicated Funds. There shall be established in the district funds called "Dedicated Funds" to be used for the purpose cited when the funds were raised. Interest earned on the Dedicated Funds shall be transferred to the Operating Fund. Dedicated Funds will be collected and used for the following: activities: (a) District Conference: Up to fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) shall be budgeted for the purpose of funding the district responsibilities at the District Conference. These funds may be used to pay for costs of meeting facilities, expense of the Rotary International President's Representative and partner and his/her Aide, speakers, advertising, decorations, printing, public address systems, media equipment, accommodations and facilities for the District Governor and partner, District Governor-Elect and partner, District Governor-Nominee and partner and (when needed) the District Conference chairperson and other such expenses required for the district to hold a conference. Conference fund should not be used to subsidize meals, housing, tours or other expenses of individual Rotarians except in the instance where the district receives benefits free or at a reduced rate from that which it would ordinarily pay as a result of minimum attendance. In such instance, the fund may be used to the extent of the saving as an incentive for attendance. It is intended that the amount collected each year will be expended for the Conference in the Rotary year collected. Any unspent balance will remain in the fund and accrue as a reserve. The District Conference Dedicated Fund shall be limited to an amount equal to the sum of those funds that accrued for the current year and the previous year. Should the amount of the Dedicated Fund for the District Conference on January 1st of the Rotary year exceed this limitation, then the dues from the clubs for this fund during the following year shall be reduced per Rotarian by the amount resulting from dividing the surplus by the January 1st district membership and rounding to the nearest dollar. (b) Any other dedicated funds shall be identified by name and any unspent balances remaining unspent after a period of two (2) years shall be transferred to the District Reserve Fund.

<u>Section 4.</u> District Finance Committee. A District Finance Committee shall be established to review and study the expenses for the administration of Rotary in the district. The committee shall be composed of five (5) voting members. Each current District Governor shall appoint one (1) member to the committee to serve a term of three (3) years. The members of the committee shall select one (1) of its members to serve as chairperson of the committee. The District Governor and District Governor-Elect shall also be voting members. The District Treasurer and District Governor-Nominee shall be non-voting members.

Section 5. Budget Preparation. The District Governor-Elect, with the concurrence of the District Finance Committee, shall prepare a budget of District expenditures and income for the coming Rotary year with a designated per capita levy. This budget shall be submitted to the clubs in the district by faxing, e-mailing or mailing a copy of the budget to each club president-elect at least thirty (30) days prior to the District Assembly or PETS as determined by the District Governor-Elect. The proposed budget shall include adequate funds to ensure the effective operation of the district. The district shall provide budgeted funds for the publishing and distribution of the annual District Directory and printing and distribution of District Governor Newsletters. Directories and newsletters shall be sent to all clubs in the district as well as to Past District Governors, Assistant Governors, current District Governors in our zone and district committeemen as determined by the District Governor. Operating Funds, Reserve Funds, and Dedicated Funds shall be identified separately in the budget with estimated income and expenses for each. All items in the Operating Fund Budget will be identified as "Allowance" or "Estimated Expenses". Budget items for the costs of trips to PETS, Zone meetings, and International Conventions will be allowances. Items intended to offset or supplement the Governor's expenses, for such items as the District Directory and Newsletter, gifts, "seed money" for new programs and similar items will normally be Budgeted amounts for items that are not allowances shall be considered estimated expenses. Savings in one (1) budget item may be transferred to another budget item with the approval of the Finance Committee. The district is not obligated to reimburse "Estimated Expenses" that are in excess of the budgeted amount. It is intended, however, that the full cost of such items be paid by the district. Should the estimated expense of any budgeted amount appear to be inadequate, the person responsible for the activity should submit a request to the District Governor for additional funding. Should an Allowance for a budgeted trip prove to be less than enough to cover reasonable transportation, housing in the designated hotel, meals and charges for program activities, then a supplemental allowance should be requested from the District Governor for the excess costs. With the recommendation of the District Governor, the Finance Committee may make an adjustment in the budget to the extent of known or reasonably estimated savings. Only one (1) Rotarian, being the committee chairperson or designee,

other than the District Governor, may be authorized to make commitments against a particular budget item.

<u>Section 6.</u> Budget Approval. The budget and per capita levy on clubs must be approved by three-fourths (3/4ths) of the club presidents-elect present at the District Assembly, PETS or District Conference as announced by the District Governor.

Section 7. Dues. Payment of the per capita levy approved at the District Assembly is mandatory on all clubs of the district and is due and payable on the next July 1st following the District Assembly in which it was adopted. The levy of each club shall be determined on membership as reported by the club in its last December attendance report preceding the budget year. If a club has failed to pay the levy for more than six (6) months after the July 1st due date, the District Governor shall certify such non-payment to the Board of Directors of Rotary International requesting the suspension of all services of Rotary International to the club while the levy remains unpaid. All district service shall also be suspended during such period of non-payment.

<u>Section 8.</u> Depository for Funds. District funds shall be held in one (1) or more bank accounts approved by the Finance Committee in the name of the district. The District Treasurer, District Governor, District Governor Elect, and chairperson of the Finance Committee shall be signatories on these accounts. The Treasurer shall maintain district accounts in an institution guaranteed by FDIC. Two signatures are required to sign checks or withdraw funds.

Section 9. Financial Records. The District Treasurer shall cause to be kept careful, accurate and detailed records of all receipts and expenditures of district funds. A monthly report of receipts and expenditures shall be supplied to the District Governor, District Governor-Elect, District Governor-Nominee, Assistant Governors and members of the Finance Committee. District funds shall only be disbursed in accordance with budget authorization. The finance committee shall have the authority, upon a showing of good cause, to amend the district budget during a budget year, but in no event may expenditures exceed the total expenditures approved by the club presidents-elect at the District Assembly, PETS or District Conference without the approval of three-fourths (3/4ths) of the club presidents-elect voting by written ballot.

<u>Section 10.</u> Investing Guidelines. The District Finance Committee shall be the Investment Committee for the District Reserve Funds and District Designated Funds. It shall determine the type, length and place of investments and manage the funds. Except for brief periods when funds are being collected or disbursed, all funds shall be kept in interest bearing accounts. Such accounts shall be fully covered by FDIC or be U.S. Government bonds, bills or notes not longer than five (5) years in maturity. At least three (3) quotations shall be received on bank certificates of deposit.

Section 11. Financial Reports. The accountant person enlisted or employed by the district shall maintain records of all financial conditions and transactions of the district and shall prepare the following monthly reports; (a) balance sheet; (b) income and expense statement reflecting "this month" and "year to date" budgeted amounts and comparison with budget; (c) Accounts receivable (until balance is -0-). All reports shall be transmitted to the District Governor, District Governor-Elect, District Governor-Nominee, Assistant Governors, District Treasurer and each member of the Finance Committee no later than the 15th of the month following the report date. A final year ending Statement and Report of District Finances shall be provided to the District Governor, District Governor-Elect, District Governor-Nominee, and all finance committee members within three months of the completion of the Governor's year in office.

The Annual Statement and Report shall include but not be limited to details of:

- (a) all sources of the District funds (RI, The Rotary Foundation, district and club);
- (b) all funds received by or on behalf of the district from fundraising activities
- (c) grants received from The Rotary Foundation or funds of The Rotary Foundation designated by the district for use;
- (d) all financial transactions of district committees;
- (e) all financials of the governor by or on behalf of the district;
- (f) all expenditures of the district's funds; and

(g) all funds received by the governor from RI.

The Statement and Report will be reviewed by a qualified accountant or by a district audit committee prior to presentation to the District Governor, District Governor-Elect, District Governor-Nominee, and all members of the Finance committee. If a District Audit Committee is selected to review the reports, the members shall be appointed by the person who served as District Governor-Elect for the year being reviewed. If the District Governor-Elect is unable to appoint the members, the members shall be appointed by the person who served as District Governor-Nominee for the year being reviewed. The Audit committee must

- (a) be composed by at least three and no more than five members;
- (b) have all the members be active Rotarians from the District;
- (c) have at least one member who is a past governor or a person with audit experience;
- (d) not allow the following to serve on the audit committee for the year in which they served in these positions; governor, treasurer, signatories of district bank accounts, and members of the finance committee.

The annual Statement and Report shall be presented for discussion and adoption at the next district meeting to which all clubs are entitled to send a representative and for which 30 days notice has been given that the Statement and Report of district finances will be presented. If no such district meeting is held, the Statement and Report shall be presented for discussion and adoption at the next district conference.

Section 12. Reimbursement of Expenses. Upon submission of paid receipts, expenses shall be reimbursed to the person indicated on the budget as the responsible person for the budget item, or payment may be made directly to a vendor when authorized in writing by a person responsible for an item. The district will accept reimbursement requests or vendor's invoices for the Rotary year until August 20th, following the end of the Rotary year (but urges all such submissions to be timely). In the instance of an on-going activity at the end of the Rotary year (such as Youth Exchange) a budget balance may be transferred to the following year. Such transferred amount shall not be exceeded and only those expenses that are a part of the on-going activity may be covered.

<u>Section 13. District Foundation.</u> For the purpose of helping to finance the charitable endeavours of the district a 501c3 type foundation may be set up with trustees.

ARTICLE VIII. DISTRICT GOVERNOR NOMINATIONS

<u>Section 1.</u> Candidate Qualifications. For the purpose of complying with Article 13 (13.020), of the Bylaws of Rotary International in selecting a District Governor-Nominee a district nominating committee procedure shall be used. The qualifications of candidates for District Governor-Nominee shall be as set out in Article 15 (15.070) of the Bylaws of Rotary International. A candidate shall be selected by a nominating committee procedure in accordance with Article 13 (13.010) of the Bylaws of Rotary International.

Section 2. District Governor Nominating Committee. A District Nominating Committee for the purpose of complying with the Bylaws of Rotary International and District 5910 shall be as set out in Article VIII of these Bylaws. The Nominating Committee shall consist of the immediate Past District Governor, who shall serve as the chairperson of the committee, plus one (1) Rotarian from each area of the district represented by an Assistant Governor. These members shall be active members of a club in the district and shall be well-informed about Rotary and Rotarians in the district. In order to help insure that they are well informed, they shall have served a full term as a club president prior to their service on the committee. Additionally, they should be active at the district level as evidenced by their attendance at three (3) of the (5) five district conferences immediately preceding their service on the committee.

Section 3. Committee Chairperson. The immediate Past District Governor who serves as convener and chairperson of this committee, shall constitute the Nominating Committee based on criteria set forth in Section 2 above and Section 6 below, after all candidates for District Governor-Nominee have been identified, but no later than twenty-four (24) months prior to the DGN being selected taking office. Clubs in the district are encouraged to propose qualified Rotarians to the chairperson to assist him in constituting the committee. The chairperson will constitute this committee based on his knowledge of

those individuals most informed about district affairs, together with proposals from the clubs and recommendations from each Assistant Governor. An effort will be made to rotate clubs within each Area annually to ensure equal representation among clubs. No individual may serve for more than two (2) successive years on this committee.

<u>Section 4.</u> Voting. A majority vote of those committee members present at the meeting of the committee shall be required to select the District Governor-Nominee. The chairperson may participate in the discussions concerning the selection of the District Governor-Nominee but may only vote in the event of a tie. In the event that the immediate Past District Governor is unable to serve in the capacity indicated, the first available Past District Governor in reverse order of service shall serve as convener and chairperson of the Nominating Committee.

Section 5. Election Timetable and Certification. The District Governor shall issue on or before thirty (30) months prior to the candidate taking office, a request to all clubs in the district for proposals of individuals to serve as District Governor-Nominee. Proposals shall be sent to and received by the District Governor on a date set by the District Governor but no later than twenty-seven (27) months prior to the candidate taking office. Immediately after this date, all proposals shall be forwarded to the chairperson of the Nominating Committee who in turn shall immediately forward the proposals and any supporting documentation to all committee members and alternates. The Nominating Committee shall meet to select the District Governor-Nominee on a date set by the Nominating Committee Chairperson or District Governor but no later than-twenty-four (24) months prior to the candidate taking office. The committee in making its selection shall not be limited to proposals made by clubs. Immediately after making the selection, but in no event later than twenty-four (24) months prior to the candidate taking office, the chairperson of the Nominating Committee shall notify the District Governor of the committee's selection. The District Governor shall publish the name and club of the nominee to all clubs in the district prior to twenty-four (24) months prior to the candidate taking office. Notwithstanding any nomination made by the Nominating Committee, any club in the district may propose a candidate for District Governor-Nominee whose name had previously been duly proposed to the Nominating Committee. Such candidate shall be proposed by a resolution adopted at a regular club meeting naming the candidate. The resolution shall be certified by the club secretary and must be received by the District Governor on or before twenty-three (23) months prior to the candidate taking office or earlier date designated by the District Governor. If no proposed candidate applications are received by this date, the District Governor shall declare the selection of the Nominating Committee to be the District Governor-Nominee and shall so notify all clubs in the district within ten (10) days of the resolution due date. If any proposed candidate or candidates are received by twenty-three (23) months prior to the candidate taking office or earlier date designated by the District Governor, the District Governor shall notify all clubs in the district of the proposed candidate or candidates and the selection of the Nominating Committee. The notice shall include the name and club of all candidates and a statement that the District Governor-Nominee will be elected by a ballot by mail, fax or e-mail or at the District Conference. The election shall be in accordance with Article 13 (13.020), of the Bylaws of Rotary International and Article 13, Section 2 of these Bylaws.

Section 6. Qualification Interview. The committee may request that those individuals proposed by clubs to serve as District Governor-Nominee be present at a meeting of the committee to be interviewed concerning their qualifications for the position. Not more than thirty-six (36)_months, but not less than twenty-four (24) months prior to the day of taking office, the chairperson shall schedule a meeting for interviews. Notice by mail, fax or e-mail shall be provided to all proposed individuals stating the date, time and location of the meeting.

Section 7. Election at District Conference or by Ballot. If the Nominating Committee cannot agree on a candidate, the chairperson of the committee shall inform the District Governor on or before twenty-four (24) months prior to the day of taking office or earlier date designated by the District Governor. The District Governor shall notify all clubs in the district of the proposals made to the Nominating Committee. The notice shall include the name and club of each candidate. The notice shall state that the District Governor-Nominee will be elected by mail, fax or e-mail or at the District Conference. The election shall be in accordance with Article 13 (13.020.6), of the Bylaws of Rotary International and Article XII, Section 2 of these Bylaws.

ARTICLE IX. RESOLUTIONS

Section 1. Resolution Proposals and Notice. Items not covered by these Bylaws may be addressed by resolution at the District Conference. A resolution may be proposed by a club or by the District's Resolutions Committee. All resolutions to be considered by the District Conference shall be submitted to the District Governor at least forty-five (45) days prior to the District Conference. The proposed resolution shall be referred to the Resolutions Committee which shall summarize each resolution and send or cause to be sent a copy of the summary to all club presidents and secretaries at least thirty (30) days prior to the District Conference. All Resolutions should comply with the Bylaws and Policies or Rotary International.

<u>Section 2.</u> Emergency Resolutions. An emergency resolution may be introduced by the Resolutions Committee at the District Conference without the required thirty (30) days notice. A resolution introduced at the conference shall require a three-fourths (3/4) majority vote for passage.

<u>Section 3.</u> Automatic Resolution Termination. Resolutions adopted at a District Conference will terminate at the next District Conference unless renewed at that District Conference.

<u>Section 4.</u> Voting Rules. Voting on resolutions shall be in accordance with Article 15 (15.050.2), of Rotary International and Article XII, Section 2 of these Bylaws.

ARTICLE X. DISTRICT TRAINING ASSEMBLY

For the purpose of providing Rotary instruction and information and the coordinating of district activities, a training assembly shall be held annually during the period between March 1st and the following July 1st as provided in and subject to the provisions of Article 15 (15.020), of the Bylaws of Rotary International. The training assembly shall be planned and conducted by the District Governor-Elect with the cooperation of the District Governor. The site should be selected and announced in time to be included in the District Directory of the Rotary year in which it will occur.

ARTICLE XI. PRESIDENTS-ELECT TRAINING SEMINAR (PETS)

For the purpose of orientation and training of Rotary club presidents-elect in the district, a Presidents-Elect Training Seminar (PETS) shall be held annually after the International Assembly but in any case prior to April 15th, preferably in March, as provided in and subject to the provisions of Article 15 (15.030), of the Bylaws of Rotary International. The district may cooperate with other districts in conducting this seminar subject to the terms and guidelines of Rotary International concerning multi-district activities. All PEs or a DG approved designee shall attend PETS to be eligible to serve as Club President in accordance with Article 9, Section 5 of the Standard Rotary Club Constitution.

ARTICLE XII. DISTRICT CONFERENCE

Section 1. Site Selection. A conference of district Rotarians shall be held annually at such time and place in the district as shall be agreed upon by the District Governor to serve during the year of the conference and the presidents of a majority of clubs in the district as provided in and subject to the provisions of Article 15 (15.040), of the Bylaws of Rotary International. A club that desires to host a future District Conference may make a presentation at the District Conference that occurs two (2) years prior to hosting. A meeting of the District Governor-Nominee and the current presidents-elect of the clubs shall be held at the District Conference at which the presentations were made or at the next District Assembly held after the District Conference in which presentations were made and the location and date of the District Conference shall be selected. A vote of a majority of the club presidents-elect attending shall be necessary to select a site and date. The District Conference may be held conjointly with two (2) or more districts and/or outside of the boundaries of the district subject to the approval of the Board of Directors of Rotary International, in accordance with Article 15 (15.040) RI Bylaws.

Section 2. Voting and Elector Selection. All conference voting shall be in accordance with the provisions of Article 15 (15.050) of the Bylaws of Rotary International. Generally every active member in good standing of a club in the district who is present at the District Conference shall be entitled to vote on all matters except that any elector shall have the right to demand a poll on any matter presented to the conference, in which event the voting shall be restricted to electors. Voting for the election of the district's Representative to the Council on Legislation shall be restricted to electors. Each club shall select, certify and send to the annual District Conference one (1) elector for every twenty-five (25), or major fraction thereof, of its members, honorary members excepted, provided that each club in the district in good standing shall be entitled to at least one (1) elector. Each elector shall be an active member of the club

from which he/she is elected. A simple majority vote of those present and voting shall be required for the election of any individual or the passage of any item unless a different vote is required by these Bylaws or the Bylaws of Rotary International.

ARTICLE XIII. DISTRICT COMMITTEES

Section 1. Selection of District Committees. In addition to those specific committees required in these Bylaws, the District Governor-Elect, on or before March 15th of the year the District Governor takes office, shall appoint such other committees as are necessary for the proper management and functioning of district activities. A chairperson should be named for each committee appointed. In making district appointments, the District Governor-Elect shall in so far as possible attempt to ensure representation of all clubs in the district.

Section 2. Rules of Procedure, Ex Officio Members, Purpose, and Mission. All district committees of a continuing nature shall adopt rules of procedure that are consistent with the Constitution and Bylaws of Rotary International. The current District Governor and the District Governor-Elect and DGN are ex officio, non-voting members of these committees. Each committee should draft a purpose and mission statement describing its function and goals.

Section 3. Continuing District Committees. District committees of a continuing nature shall be as follows:

<u>Section 4.</u> District Liability. General Liability insurance for districts in the United States and its territories and possessions will be provided through RI. Each district will be assessed an amount sufficient to fund the insurance coverage and related administrative expenses. (RCP 71.080) Additional insurance may be purchased by the district.

ARTICLE XIV. DISTRICT DIRECTORY

The District Governor shall cause to be printed a District Directory listing appropriate district and club officers and containing such other information as necessary for the effective management of the district. Funding for the printing of the District Directory shall be provided by a specific allowance in the district budget. Copies of the District Directory in printed and/or electronic form shall be distributed to each club president and secretary, to all past officers of Rotary International residing in the district and to such other individuals as determined by the District Governor for the effective management of the district. The District Directory should be printed prior to and distributed at the District Assembly or District Conference as determined by the District Governor-Elect. The District directory shall include a copy of the Bylaws of Rotary International District 5910 with amendments adopted through the District Conferences occurring prior to publishing or proposed at the next District Conference if the Assembly is held before the District Conference.

ARTICLE XV. DISTRICT 5910 ROLL OF FAME

<u>Section 1.</u> Selection of Committee. The District Governor shall appoint a Roll of Fame Committee Chairperson each year. The Committee Chairperson may be a member of any Club in the District and

must be a Roll of Fame Member. The Committee Chairperson will appoint at least three (3) committee members from different clubs in the District and each member must be a Roll of Fame Member. The Committee shall be responsible for the details of this activity at each annual District Conference.

<u>Section 2.</u> Roster of Honorees. A permanent roster of honorees, including those previously honored, shall be prepared and maintained and published in the District Directory.

<u>Section 3.</u> Nominations. The District Governor shall, during the month of December, invite each Rotary club within the district to submit to the committee chairperson the name of one (1) of its members as a nominee to the District Roll of Fame. The Governor shall advise the clubs of the criteria to be used by the committee in selecting Rotarians to be added to the Roll of Fame. These criteria are:

- Honoree must have served as an officer or director of a Rotary Club and must have been a Rotarian in one (1) or more clubs for five (5) years prior to submission of the honoree's name.
- The honoree must have an above average attendance record.
- The honoree should have attended Rotary clubs other than the club of the honoree, and must have attended at least one (1) District Conference and one (1) District Assembly.
- The honoree should have chaired or actively served on several club committees in more than one (1) of the five avenues of service.
- Outstanding service in Rotary shall be the primary consideration. Civic accomplishments may be mentioned in the submitted biography, but shall not be a basis for recognition.
- The name of a Rotarian, previously enrolled in the Roll of Fame should not be submitted.
- Honoree is expected to appear in person at District Conference to receive and accept the honor.

If no member of a club fits the criteria for any given year, such club shall not submit a nominee for such year.

The President of a Rotary club within the district which wishes to nominate one (1) of its members as an Honoree shall notify in writing the committee chairperson of the member's name. It should be stated that the selection has the approval of the club's Board of Directors, and provide a short statement of facts outlining the nominee's contributions to the furtherance of Rotary, its principles, and its programs.

The Committee must approve the credentials of each nominee.

ARTICLE XVI. INTERPRETATION

Throughout these Bylaws, pronouns of a masculine gender shall include the feminine and vice versa.

ARTICLE XVII. AMENDMENTS

Section 1. When Can Amend. These Bylaws may be amended at the District Conference.

<u>Section 2.</u> Voting. Voting on the amendment of these Bylaws shall be in accordance with Article 15 (15.050), of the Bylaws of Rotary International and Article XII, Section 2 of these Bylaws.

<u>Section 3.</u> Amendment Proposals. Amendments to these Bylaws may be proposed by any club in good standing in the district by a club resolution, or by the district Resolutions Committee.

<u>Section 4.</u> Notice. Any proposal to amend these Bylaws shall be delivered to the District Governor at least forty-five (45) days prior to the District Conference. The District Governor shall give notice by email, fax, or U.S. mail to all club presidents and secretaries of all proposed amendments at least thirty (30) days prior to the District Conference.
