Tentative Travel Plan for the Outbound Team, from the Inbound Coordinator in District 7020:

"The Texas GSE Team will start the exchange in the BVI [British Virgin Islands] where they will spend one week. They will then travel, via ferry, to our neighbors to the south, St. Thomas, USVI [U.S. Virgin Islands] where they will spend another week. Following that, they will hop a plane to St. Croix, USVI for week three.

The last leg of the journey will take the team to St. Martin, Anguilla and St. Baths [St. Barts] for week four. Quite a bit of island hopping, by both ferry and plane, if I may say so myself.

We have hosted many GSE teams here in the BVI over the past years and look forward to hosting the Texas team with great anticipation.

We are known for our hospitality and wonderful weather, culture and waters. The BVI is known as the sailing capital of the world. We also boast beautiful dive sites in the BVI and hosted a Rotary Fellowship Dive Group from Canada and the US earlier this year.
