The History of Rotary

Paul Harris organized the first Rotary Club in Chicago on February 23, 1905. He gathered together a small group of businessmen in lines of business other than his own so they could become better acquainted. He coined the name "Rotary Club" to signify how the members "rotated" the meetings at each of their businesses.

The practice of rotating meetings from one member's place of business to another was dropped when the size of the club made it unwieldy, and luncheon meetings were initiated. Today, Rotary has more than 32,000 members worldwide.

What is Rotary?

Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build good will and peace in the world. It is the largest service organization in the world with over 1300 clubs and over 32000 members doing great work around the globe. WE ARE THE LARGEST SERVICE CLUB IN THE AREA, WITH MORE THAN 150 MEMBERS.

What is the object of Rotary?

“...to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise.” Rotary’s motto is “Service Above Self.”

Who are members of Rotary?

Individuals who are active in the community, or who want to increase their efforts to improve the quality of life in central Iowa. They can come from just about any walk in life, but need to commit themselves to Rotary’s goals and ideals, and be ready to step up when asked. “A Rotary member always starts with Yes.”

What is the cost of membership?
