## D6000 CSG

#### What do you need to know?

- How community service grants work
- Mistakes to avoid
- How to file a final report





- Clubs submit applications to D6000 CSG co-Chairs by June 1, 2023.
- 2. Applications reviewed by D6000 CSG review committee June 24, 2023
- 3. D6000 CSG review committee approves and submits funding request to TRF.
- 4. TRF remits funds to D6000 for distribution.
- 5. Funds distributed to clubs for projects. NOTE ONLY IF THE PREVIOUS YEARS GRANT IS FINALIZED
- 6. Clubs manages grant details thru the life of the project
- Clubs file final report and documentation with D6000 CSG Co Chairs to finish the project due <u>June 1, 2024</u>

## **APPLYING FOR A CS GRANT**

- Each club will receive a packet electronic to be sent March 1, 2023 out
  - Contents
    - Quick Reference Guide
    - D6000 Local Rules
    - Application for a Community Service Grant for 2023-2024 reminder due June 1, 2023
    - Grant Score Breakdown (100 points applicable)
    - Final Report form and checklist reminder due June 1, 2024

## **APPLYING FOR A CS GRANT**

#### Applications MUST be submitted before June 1,2023

- <u>Ask questions</u> well in advance! What we have on June 1 is what will be submitted to the committee.
- Absolutely <u>NO</u> exceptions to this
- Submit to: <u>D6000CSG@gmail.com</u>
- Receive confirmation of receipt within 24 hours OR please contact us to ensure application was received!

## **D6000 LOCAL RULES**



- 1. Before applying for a Community Service Grant, a club must be qualified by District 6000.
- 2. Projects must take place within the geographical boundaries of District 6000.
- 3. A club may fund up to 25% of the project budget with sweat equity.
- 4. A club may apply for a maximum of \$5000.
- 5. A club must match grant funds 1:1 with club funds (or equivalent)
- 6. A Club must submit a minimum of at least annuals goals: Membership, The Rotary Foundation Giving, and Polio Giving

## **D6000** COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM SCORE BREAKDOWN

- 1. Benefit to Others (1-30 points total)

  - a. Community Benefit (1 20 points) i. Sustainable Positive Impact on the Local community.
  - b. Community Underserved / Disadvantaged (1 10 points)
    - i. Defined as providing a need or service to those who otherwise would not have the opportunity to attain or enjoy the benefit provided by the club project.
- 1. Rotary's Public Image (1-20 points)
  - a. Temporary / Permanent
    - i. Two categories provide the club with credit for projects which may not be able to utilize permanent signage while emphasizing the positive long-term impact for those projects where it is an alternative.
- 1. Club Engagement (1 20 points)
  - a. Monetary Contribution / Member Engagement (includes sweat equity)
    - i. Two categories provide the club with credit for projects whereby there is not a potential for member involvement while also providing credit for a club that contributes through member participation for community awareness.
- 1. Club Support to TRF Annual Fund (1 30 points)
  - a. Rotary suggests that Every Rotarian Every Year (EREY) contribute \$100 annually to The Rotary Foundation to support local and international projects to benefit third parties.
    - i. It becomes a point of emphasis that without "some" contributions to the foundation, club's grants will be not be fully funded or there will not be grant funds available to award individual clubs
