**DESCRIPTION**: The award is named in honor of Boone Rotarian and Past District Governor, Judge Paul E. Hellwege (1912–2010). It was established to promote service, as well as the ideals of integrity, fairness and respect, which were Paul's fervent passions. The awards will be presented annually to Rotarians who have made outstanding service contributions that exemplify these ideals in their personal and professional lives. To qualify, nominees must have been a member of a club in District 6000 for a minimum of three years. There can be only one nomination per club per year. The annual deadline for submission is February 15. Those who are nominated will be recognized at the annual District Conference.

In an essay of 250 to 500 words, highlight why your nominee is deserving of recognition as a Rotary *Guardian of Integrity Award* recipient. Following the points discussed below, emphasize your nominees' specific actions or initiatives that illustrate Rotary *service*, as well as qualities of *integrity, fairness and respect*.

- Describe your nominees' personal commitment to serving others, whether locally or globally.
- Discuss the broader impact of their contributions on individuals and communities.
- Note how their efforts to serve others exemplified fairness and respect.
- Explain how their actions reflect Rotary's value of high ethical standards in their personal and professional lives.
