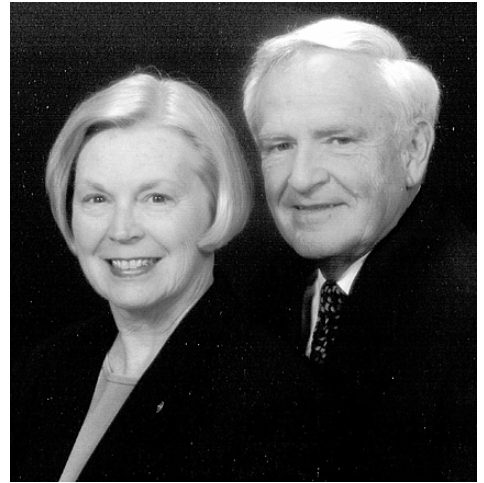


District Governor Diana Reed
